20	The following terms as used in this division have the following meanings unless the context					
21	clearly indicates otherwise:					
22	(1)	Children's meal means a combination of food items and a beverage, or a single food				
23	item and a l	beverage, sold together at a single price, primarily intended for consumption by a child.				
24	(2)	Default beverage means the drink that is included or offered in the children's meal				
25	absent a customer's request for a specific beverage.					
26	Sec. 23-61.	- Default beverages in children's meals.				
27	(a)	On and after July 1, 2025, a retail food establishment that sells a children's meal shall				
28	make the default beverage sold with the children's meal one of the following items:					
29	(1)	Water, still or sparkling, with no added sugar; or				
30	(2)	Dairy milk or non-dairy milk substitute with no added sugar.				
31	(b)	Menus shall only list the beverages described in subsection (a) of this section in				
32	conjunction with children's meals. Employees shall not offer any beverage other than the default					
33	beverage.					

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2	(c) Nothing in this section prohibits a retail food establishment's ability to sell, or the					
3	customer's ability to purchase, any other beverage that is available if requested by the purchaser of					
4	the children's meal.
