

## Proposed Boundary





- Properties designated "as is"
  - No required improvements
- Design Review
  - Goal to preserve historic character of the property
  - All exterior alterations require
    Landmark review
- Demolition highly discouraged
  - Requires Commission review
- Eligible for Historic
  Preservation Tax Credits



Who Can Apply for Designation?

#### Community-driven process

- Owner(s) of the property
- Manager of Community
  Planning and Development
- Member(s) of City Council
- Three residents of Denver











#### Landmark Designation Eligibility

#### The structure or district must meet the following criteria \*:

- 1. Maintains its integrity
- 2. More than 30 years old, or is of exceptional importance
- 3. Meets at least three of ten criteria
- 4. The LPC considers the historic context

\*Per Landmark Preservation Ordinance (Chapter 30, DRMC)

#### Designation Criteria: Meet 4 out of 10

#### **History**

- A. Historic development of city
- B. Recognized persons who had influence on society

#### **Architecture**

- C. Visible characteristics of architectural style or type
- D. Significant example of recognized architect or master builder
- E. Significant innovation or technical achievement

#### **Geography**

- F. Familiar feature of neighborhood, due to physical character
- G. Understanding of urban environment through physical characteristics or rarity

#### Culture

- H. Cultural understanding of how the site was used by past generations
- I. Physical attribute that is source of pride or cultural understanding
- J. Social movements, institutions, or patterns of growth that contributed to culture




 Regularity and balance without symmetry

### International Style

- Avant-garde and architect-designed
- Modern architecture introduced by architects emigrating to escape chaos in Europe
- Brought experience with architecture designed to exploit modern materials and technology
- Emphasized building functionalism and the elimination of any features that were just decorative
- Most domestic examples from 1930s in Northeast or California

#### International Style Residential

- Minimal decoration
- Flat roof
- Smooth wall surfaces
- Asymmetrical
- Long ribbons of windows
- Plate glass windows set flush with wall
- Large blank expanses of exterior walls



#### C. Embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of an architectural style or

type;

- Excellent example of an Internationalstyle residence in Denver
- Character-defining features of 2323 E.
  Dakota Ave.
  - Horizontality
  - Asymmetry
  - Ribbon windows
  - Cubist conception of building volumes
  - Lack of ornamentation
  - Flat roof

#### D. Significant example of the work of a recognized architect or master builder

- Casper Forman Hegner
  - Born 1909 in Ohio, moved to Denver in 1913
  - Degrees from Princeton and Yale
  - In 1931 he traveled to Europe and studied at the summer program of the American School of Fine Arts (Fontainebleau, France)



#### D. Significant example of the work of a recognized architect or master builder

- Casper Forman Hegner
  - Moved to Denver in 1935
  - 2323 E. Dakota Ave earliest Denver work and the most intact example of his early International-style dwellings
  - After WWII, established Smith,
    Hegner, and Moore and, later, Smith and Hegner








- Barry Lorie
  - Lived at 2323 E. Dakota Ave. from 1965-1985
  - Actor, producer, and public relations professional
  - Established Lorie-Litito Public Relations, handling Denver promotion and publicity for several studios, including Columbia

- Barry Lorie
  - Held senior executive-level publicity and marketing positions for Columbia, Fox, Universal, MGM, and Disney
  - Lorie: "If a movie is a big success, people often say it's because the film was good and it was booked into the right theaters. But if a movie fails, the marketing department gets the blame because people say the ads were lousy."



#### Barry Lorie, Veteran Hollywood Marketing Executive, Dies

He worked for Columbia, Fox, Universal, Disney and MGM and on films including "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" and "Thelma & Louise."

- Minimum alterations- 1949 addition by Hegner
- Maintains all aspects of integrity
  - Original location
  - Feeling, setting, and association
  - Design, materials, and workmanship

#### **Landmark Designation Review Criteria**

- Over 30 years of age
- Application meets at least three criteria
  - B. It has direct and substantial association with a recognized person or group of persons who had influence on society;
  - C. It embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of an architectural style or type;
  - D. It is a significant example of the work of a recognized architect or master builder;
  - G. It promotes understanding and appreciation of the urban environment by means of distinctive physical characteristics or rarity.
- Retains Integrity
- LPC considers the historic context

Based on the ordinance designation criteria and on the findings of the Landmark Preservation Commission (LPC) that the application meets the criteria for designation of a structure, staff recommends forwarding the application to the full council.
