13	WHEREAS, Council approved and adopted Ordinance No. 0819, Series of 2017, designating
14	the projects to be undertaken and funded with the proceeds of any general obligation bonds
15	authorized by voters at the November 7, 2017 election (the "Initial Companion Ordinance"); and
16	WHEREAS, Council approved and adopted Ordinance No. 0291, Series of 2022, amending,
17	restating and superseding the Initial Companion Ordinance to amend the line item project list
18	contained within the Initial Companion Ordinance (the "Amended Companion Ordinance"); and
19	WHEREAS, collectively, the Initial Companion Ordinance and the Amended Companion
20	Ordinance shall be referred to herein as the "Original Companion Ordinance;" and
21	WHEREAS, Section 3 of the Original Companion Ordinance provided that, "[within] each
22	purpose, any modifications to add or remove a line item project will require an amendment to [the
23	Original Companion Ordinance] by the Denver City Council whenever a line item project set forth in
24	[the Original Companion Ordinance] includes a list of specific locations where the project will be
25	undertaken, any modification to remove any listed located will require an amendment to [the Original
26	Companion Ordinance] by the Denver City Council;" and
27	WHEREAS, certain amendments to the line item project list contained within the Original

WHEREAS, certain amendments to the line item project list contained within the Original Companion Ordinance are needed since the adoption of the Original Companion Ordinance, necessitating an amendment to the Original Companion Ordinance in conformance with Section 3 thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend, restate and supersede Ordinance No. 0819, Series of 2022 and Ordinance No. 0291, Series of 2022 in their respective entirety, with additions to the Original Companion Ordinance noted below in bold type, and deletions noted below by being struck-through, all as detailed herein.

Within each purpose, any modifications to add or remove a line item project will require an amendment of this Ordinance by the Denver City Council, and whenever a line item project set forth in this Ordinance includes a list of specific locations where the project will be undertaken, any modification to remove any listed location will require an amendment to this Ordinance by the Denver City Council.

Section 4. The Chief Financial Officer, as the Manager of Finance/*Ex-Officio* Treasurer, shall describe progress of the expenditure of the funds for each purpose listed above in a report to a committee of the Denver City Council at least annually.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage by the electorate of the November 7, 2017 ballot question(s) that authorize the any general obligation bonds for the purposes referenced herein.

Section 6. This Ordinance amends, restates and supersedes both Ordinance No. 0819, Series of 2017, and Ordinance No. 0291, Series of 2022, in their respective entirety.
