Methodology



Hello. We invite you to participate in an important survey about term limits for Denver's Mayor, City Council, Clerk and Recorder and Auditor.

We want to know your opinion, so please make your voice heard. The survey will only take about 10 minutes to complete, and your answers will remain strictly anonymous and confidential. Let's get started!

Magellan Strategies is pleased to present the results of a survey of 1,595 voters in the City and County of Denver. The interviews were conducted from May 7th to May 14th, 2024. Respondents were able to take the survey in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Amharic.


The overall survey responses have a margin of error of +/- 2.45% at the 95% confidence interval. Population subgroups will have a higher margin of error than the overall sample.

The survey data were weighted to be representative of the voter demographics for a presidential election cycle in the City of Denver.





Survey Goals & Objectives



The primary objective of this survey was to measure voter support and opposition levels for a ballot measure that would reduce the number of terms the mayor, city council members, clerk and recorder, and city auditor could serve from three four-year terms to two fouryear terms.












City and County of Denver City Council Districts




Do you approve or disapprove of the job the following elected officials in Denver are doing? Mayor Mike Johnston




Do you approve or disapprove of the job the following elected officials in Denver are doing? Denver City Council


Do you approve or disapprove of the job the following elected officials in Denver are doing? City Auditor Timothy O'Brien


Do you think things in Denver are heading in the right direction, or do you feel things are off on the wrong track?





Denver Term Limit Uninformed Ballot Measure Tests



A possible ballot measure would reduce the maximum time that the mayor, city council members, clerk and recorder, and city auditor could stay in office from three four-year terms to two four-year terms.


This would mean that these elected officials could serve for at most eight years. The reduced term limits would not apply to any currently serving elected officials.






We will now share some information from supporters and opponents of shorter-term limits for elected officials, the history of term limits in Denver, and more about why this ballot measure is being discussed.

Some supporters of a two-term limit for elected officials argue that incumbents have a significant advantage when running for reelection and limiting them to two terms helps to make sure that new elected officials bring fresh ideas to city government.



In 1994, Colorado voters approved an amendment to the state constitution that limited local elected officials to two terms in office. In 2000, Denver voters approved a measure to allow the city's elected officials to serve for three terms or 12 years. This ballot measure would change the limit back to two terms.





Some supporters of a two-term limit for elected officials argue that with growing demands on city officials, there is a concern that elected officials may suffer from burnout after serving more than two terms.





Some opponents of a two-term limit for elected officials argue that if voters elect someone who they are very happy with and who they feel represents them well, that person should be able to serve for 12 years instead of 8 years.





Some opponents of a two-term limit for elected officials argue that three terms provide the right balance of experience and fresh ideas, and that the city would miss out on the important knowledge held by officials who serve longer than 8 years.








Informed Term Limits Ballot Test for Clerk and Recorder






Do you have any final thoughts to share about term limits for Denver's mayor, city council, city clerk and recorder, and city auditor?

- Frustration with Incumbents: Many respondents expressed frustration with incumbent officials, feeling that they have too much power, are out of touch with the people's needs, or are beholden to special interests.
- Concerns about Policy Priorities: There are concerns about the current administration's policy priorities, with some feeling that resources are misallocated and priorities are misplaced, particularly regarding handling the migrant situation, drugs, violence, and homelessness.
- **Desire for Change:** There is a widespread desire for change among respondents, with many expressing a desire for new leadership and fresh ideas to address the city's challenges.
- Immigration Policy: Several respondents specifically mentioned concerns about immigration policy, advocating for stricter policies or expressing frustration with the perceived prioritization of immigrants over citizens.
- Support for Term Limits: While opinions on term limits varied, there was a notable proportion of respondents who supported term limits as a means of preventing corruption, maintaining accountability, and ensuring turnover of leadership.






