Conservation Learning Programs & Community Nature Play

Expansion of Conservation Learning programs and community nature play pop-ups

- 554 Nature Play Kits Distributed
- 1250 Nature Play Pocket Guides
- 117 Denver Zoo Memberships
- 726 Denver Zoo Tickets to participants
- 129 Adults & 362 Children Participants in Year-Long programming
- 75 Families engaged in Family Nature Clubs





COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & EDUCATION

Conservation Learning Access

- More than 34,000 children and adults participated in Conservation Learning
- 3,300 received needs-based scholarship
 - Attended camp, school program, etc.
- 60 teachers participate in professional development programs
- 2,700 children joined school break camps
- Autism Certification







COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & EDUCATION

Collaboration with Local Organizations

- Black Birders Event each year since 2021
- SCFD Organization performances & Collaborations (2021)
 - Cleo Parker Robinson, Colorado Symphony,
 Colorado Ballet, Mexican Cultural Center, Dia del Nino
- Quill the porcupine's quills donated to indigenous artists
- Asian American and Pacific Islander+ Festival
- Veterans free tours + free admission during Military Appreciation week





GREAT WILD

Comprehensive Campaign

- Campaign Public Launch 2023
 - Raised \$245,000 in 30 days through matching fund
- Force of Nature Gala (\$500K) honoring Eddie Robinson
- \$1 million in community support during covid
- Flock Party launched in 2020

Comprehensive Campaign

- \$75M Comprehensive Fundraising Campaign
- Since 2019 raised \$65,091,042
- 49,467 gifts
- 19,970 unique donors
- Doubled annual fundraising amount
- Fundraising Pillars
 - Open Arms: Access + Education
 - o Open Hearts: Animal Care + Capital Projects
 - o Open Spaces: Conservation + Sustainability

 - FOCUS on the future of wildlife conservation and the future of DZCA






CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

In-Progress & Recently Completed


- Down Under Opening–\$7 million project

Construction & Infrastructure

- Goals for enhancing visitor experience and animal habitats
 - New guest barrier design
- Investments and Improvements
 - New ticketing system, HRIS implementation
- Facility Condition Assessment and campus capital projects totaling approximately \$50 million
- City Assessment indicates \$22.5 million needed annually to support deferred maintenance and current needs.






Field Conservation - International

- Laos: Elephant Conservation Center





 - 50% Water Usage Reduction
