

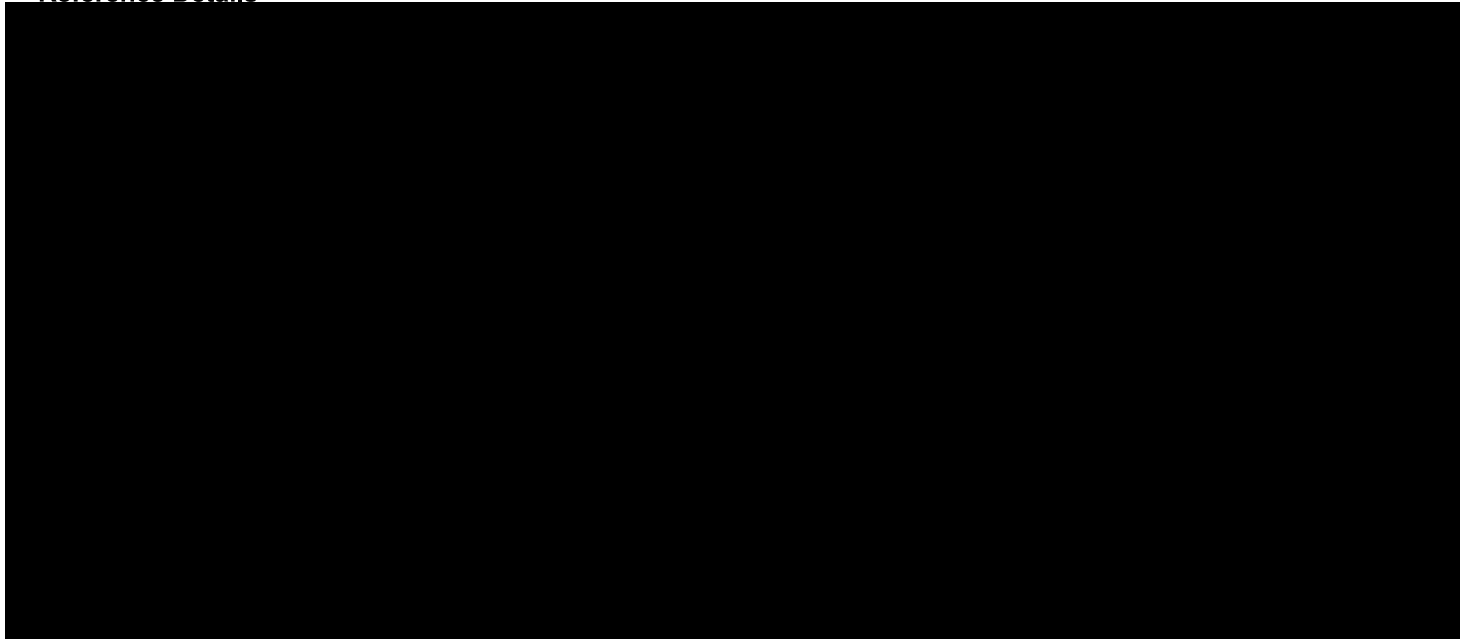

# Samuel (Sammy) L. Trout

## Education:

**Colorado State University - (August 2019 – Present)** *Fort Collins, Colorado*

## Work Experience:

**Colorado State University – Colorado Legislative Internship (January 2023 – April 2023)** *Denver, Colorado*

- Legislative Intern
  - Worked with a member of the Colorado House of Representative’s Democratic Caucus, Representative Mary Young
  - Co-wrote bill research for the House Committee on Public & Behavioral Health & Human Services as well as conducted political and policy analysis for bills going through the General Assembly. The policy analysis included confirming stances on lobbyists, changes in current statute, and the specific funding allocation.
  - Worked on as a graphic designer for social media, ensuring the images were accessible with alt text and via other accessibility standards.

**Off-Campus Life & RamRide (August 2022 – Present)** *Fort Collins, Colorado*

- OCL Program Assistant & RamRide Nightly Operations Coordinator – (August 2022 – Present)
  - Provided students with information regarding housing resources in the Fort Collins area. Registered volunteer groups to OCL’s various volunteer events, registered parties, and managed the staff email as well as delivered food and other basic need supplies to students via RamRide’s Food Operations.
  - Oversaw night operations of RamRide, CSU’s free SafeRide program ensuring that volunteer drivers and navigators received through training as well as support throughout the night.
  - Wrote incident reports and went on scene to situations in which the volunteers and/or patrons needed assistance. Additionally wrote accident reports, ensuring damages/incidents were properly reported and followed up on.
  - Received Title IX & Mandatory Reporting Training, which focuses on how to let a person know what a mandatory reporter is, what resources are offered, and know how to effectively advocate for individuals upon request.
- RamRide’s Community Outreach Coordinator (“COCO”) – (October 2023 – Present)
  - Continued PA and NOC duties, while taking on additional duties like MVR checks.
  - Responsible for conducting outreach to the near 500+ student organizations at Colorado State University with the goal of getting them for volunteer RamRide on top of my PA and NOC duties.
  - Planned and coordinated outreach events that were accessible for members of student organizations to see what RamRide is and how to volunteer.
  - Lead designer for operational presentations, making and performing multiple presentations for both RamRide and OCL as needed.

**Pride Leadership Council (“PLC”) (August 2022 – Present)** *Fort Collins, Colorado*

- Senate Liaison & Pride Advocate
  - Worked with a diverse group of students who volunteer in a variety of leadership roles in the Pride Resource Center and across campus as representatives of the CSU LGBTQIA+ community.
  - Helped advocate for funding for the Lavender Cabinet, increased signage for all gender restrooms across campus, got an All-Gender restroom added to the Clark building, and have met with university leadership to discuss LGBTQIA+ student safety and more.

# Samuel (Sammy) L. Trout

- Received Safe Zone Training from the Pride Resource Center which aims to combat homophobia, transphobia, and cisheterosexism at CSU and in the surrounding community, fostering a safer environment for all members, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, or intersecting identities.

## **Associated Students of Colorado State University (“ASCSU”) (2021 – Present)** *Fort Collins, Colorado*

- Senator for the College of Liberal Arts – (September 2021 – May 2023)
  - Elected to represent over 6,400 students within the College of Liberal Arts in the Senate.
  - Wrote and passed multiple Resolutions and Bills, advocating and funding for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Social Justice initiatives across ASCSU and CSU overall. Also wrote constitutional amendments to update and clarify internal policies and procedures.
- Chair of the University Affairs Committee – (May 2022 – May 2023)
  - Managed the general administrative duties necessary for the committee to operate effectively which included drafting and passing committee bylaws to ensure the committee ran effectively and ensure accountability on members of the committee. These bylaws became the template that past and current committee chairs have utilized to draft their own bylaws.
  - Work closely with the other committee chairs to ensure streamlined communication when making changes/amendments to legislation.
  - Meet weekly with the Legislative Cabinet, which handles the administrative duties of the Senate, discuss the weekly agenda as well as the state of the Senate.
- Co-founder and Chair of the Accessibility Caucus – (August 2023 – May 2024)
  - Established the Accessibility Caucus within ASCSU in April 2023, with the goal of being an investigative interbranch Caucus with the goal to identify, review, and evaluate concerns at Colorado State University and the Fort Collins community related to accessibility and disability justice. The Caucus is also tasked with promoting legislation, programming, and a sense of community to empower disabled students in ASCSU, the student body, and the overall CSU and Fort Collins community.
  - Continued my role within the Legislative Cabinet, serving as a mentor for new members of ASCSU.
  - Established a reporting system where members of the Caucus could report their findings in which I could consolidate and interpret and in a way that is accessible.
  - Wrote a comprehensive report on the status of door buttons and the overall status of accessibility on campus using Google Sheets to compile the data, this report included recommendations and next steps for the caucus, passed the Senate with unanimous consent.
  - Earned Chair-Emeritus status following my graduation.
- Senator for the Student Disability Center – (September 2023 – May 2024)
  - Invited and appointed to serve as a member of the Student Disability Center’s Senate delegation to represent the over 8,000 students with disabilities.
  - Served on the Committee for Disabled Student Accessibility, which works directly with the SDC Director.
  - Gave counsel and advice to ASCSU members to ensure their projects, proposals, and procedures were accessible for students by our internal guidelines, CSU policy, as well as state and federal guidelines.
  - Earned Senator-Emeritus status following my graduation.
