Scope of work:

CAA Health seeks HFDK funding to transform its Hudson Street facility by creating a teaching kitchen and community garden to promote healthy food education as a social determinant of health (SDOH). The teaching kitchen will host culturally relevant cooking demonstrations and classes, particularly benefiting children aged birth-5, and will be integrated into existing programs such as Strengthening Families Program, 24/7 Dads, and Birth Squad. The garden will offer families hands-on learning experiences in growing fresh produce and herbs, fostering multigenerational engagement, and building connections to healthy food and land. A Nutrition and Garden Coordinator will oversee both initiatives, ensuring the development of high-quality, culturally relevant curricula in collaboration with early childhood and nutrition experts. Impact will be evaluated through intake and post-program assessments, demonstrating increased knowledge and excitement around healthy eating among participating families.
