6 7 8 9	For an ordinance amending Article V, Chapter 18 and Article I, Chapter 2 of the Revised Municipal Code to replace the commemorative holiday of Indigenous Peoples' Day with a designated city holiday beginning in the year 2025.	
10	WHEREAS, the State of Colorado defines "ir	ndigenous" as "having descended from people who
11	were living in North America prior to the time people from Europe began settling in North America,	
12	being an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe, or being a lineal descendant of a	
13	tribally enrolled parent or guardian;	
14	WHEREAS, the Denver City Council recognizes that the Indigenous Peoples have lived and	
15	flourished on the lands known as the Americas since time immemorial, and that Denver and the	
16	surrounding communities are built upon the ancestral homelands of numerous Indigenous people,	
17	to include two land-based sovereign nations, 49	additional Tribes with legal and historic standing,
18	and is home to the descendants of approximate	ly 150 Tribal Nations; and
19	WHEREAS, the homelands and communities of the Arapaho and Cheyenne peoples along the	
20	banks of the Cherry Creek and South Platte Riv	er confluence gave bearing to future encampments
21	of newcomers that would become the birthplace	e of the Mile High City; and
22	WHEREAS, the Denver City Council acknow	ledges that the land upon which the city stands
23	was not legally transferred under the 1861 Fort	Wise Treaty due to the lack of proper signatures as
24	required by U.S. law, resulting in the illegal trans	sfer of lands; and
25	WHEREAS, the Northern Cheyenne and Nor	thern Arapaho peoples were forcibly removed from
26	their homelands to make way for this illegal occ	upation, a legacy of displacement and injustice that
27	remains uncorrected; and	
28	WHEREAS, on October 3, 2016, the Denver	City Council unanimously passed CB16-801,
29	officially designating the second Monday of Oct	ober of each year as Indigenous Peoples' Day in
30	Denver, Colorado; and	
31	WHEREAS, the Denver City Council honors	the resilience and survivance of Indigenous people
32	despite historical and contemporary barriers that seek to extract, displace, and destroy, and	
33	recognizes that it is because of their tenacity and stewardship of knowledge, land, science,	
34	philosophy, arts, and culture that the City of Denver has developed and thrived; and	

- WHEREAS, the Denver City Council acknowledges the ongoing harm caused by the illegal
- 3 transfers of land under the 1861 Fort Wise Treaty and the forced removal of Indigenous peoples,
- 4 and that to promote the health, wellness, and safety of current and future generations of the
- 5 Indigenous community, it is of paramount importance to repair both historical and ongoing harm;

- WHEREAS, the Denver American Indian Commission is advocating for a paid city holiday for
- 8 Indigenous Peoples' Day to honor the cultural and foundational stewardship of Indigenous People
- 9 to our past, present, and future; and to promote education to the Denver community about the
- 10 historical and contemporary legacy of Indigenous People;
- 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF
- 12 **DENVER**:

- Section 1. That article 1, chapter 2, is hereby amended by deleting the language
- stricken and adding the underlined language to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 2-5. Indigenous Peoples' Day.
- On the second Monday of October in each year, hereafter to be known as "Indigenous"
- 18 Peoples' Day," appropriate observance may be held by the public in commemoration and in honor
- 19 of Denver's indigenous and original history.
- 20 Sec. 2-6. Reserved.
- 21 **Secs. 2-75—2-15. Reserved.**

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- **Section 2.** That article V, chapter 18, is hereby amended by deleting the language stricken
- 24 and adding the underlined language to read as follows:
- 25 Sec. 18-142. Designation of holidays.
- 26 "Holidays" for the purposes of this article shall mean eight (8) hours in the following days:
- 27 (1) New Year's Day (January 1);
- 28 (2) Martin Luther King Day (third Monday in January);
- 29 (3) Washington's Birthday (to be observed on the third Monday in February);
- 30 (4) Cesar Chavez Day (last Monday in March);
- 31 (5) Memorial Day (last Monday in May);
