Executive Summary Santa Fe BID 2017 Operating Plan and Budget

Business Improvement Districts (BID's) are organized for the benefit of commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and their maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities. This is the operating plan and budget for the **Santa Fe BID** and it is submitted annually.

General Description of District and Location: The service area consists of commercial extending 7 blocks made up of 130 properties located along both sides of Santa Fe Drive from 6th Avenue to 13th Avenue.

The main purpose of the BID is to improve the economic vitality and overall commercial appeal of properties in the BID. The BID provides programming and benefits to taxable business and commercial properties located within the proposed boundaries that includes economic development, physical improvements, safety, and advocacy.

District Structure: The District has no debt and no mill levy, but assesses commercial property owners with a special assessment. The proposed 2017 budget contemplates two assessment rates: \$7.81/lf of commercial property fronting Santa Fe Dr. and \$0.099/sf of commercial building. The proposed budgetary expenses for 2017 is **\$136,310**. The Board of Directors is composed of 7 citizens.
