For an ordinance adding new fees for the Levitt Pavilion under sub-section 39-121(22) of the Revised Municipal Code.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

**Section 1.** That subsection 22 (Levitt Pavilion fees) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be added to read as follows:

**39-121.** (22) Levitt Pavilion fees: Starting January 1, 2017, the following are the fees payable for the commercial or community rental of the Levitt Pavilion at Ruby Hill Park:

Then, starting January 1, 2021, the fees for all commercial and community "ticketed events" shall be either the fee specified above, or five percent (5%) of total ticket sales, whichever amount is greater. The Manager of Parks and Recreation may require documentation demonstrating the total ticket sales and the amount charged per ticket. The fees above shall not include the 10% facilities development admission tax, which shall be collected and paid separately to the city department of finance.

**Section 2.** That this ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.
