AMENDATORY AGREEMENT

THIS AMENDATORY AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER, a municipal corporation of the State of Colorado (the "City") and MILE HIGH MONTESSORI EARLY LEARNING CENTERS, a Colorado not-for-profit corporation, whose address is 1780 Marion Street, Denver, Colorado 80218 (the "Contractor") collectively "the parties".

RECITALS:

- **A.** The City and Contractor entered into an Agreement dated May 25, 2016, to provide comprehensive Head Start services for program year 2016-2017 (the "Agreement").
- **B.** The City and the Contractor wish to amend the Agreement to increase the Maximum Contract Amount to be paid to the Contractor and increase the total amount of non-federal share to be provided by the Contractor under the Agreement.

The Parties agree as follows:

- 1. All references in the Agreement to Exhibit B are amended to read as Exhibits B and B-1, as applicable. The budget marked as Exhibit B-1 is attached and incorporated into the Agreement by this reference. Effective as of July 1, 2016, Exhibit B-1 will supplement Exhibit B and payment under the Agreement will be made in accordance with Exhibit B and B-1.
- 2. All references in the Agreement to Exhibit D are amended to read as Exhibits D and D-1, as applicable. The document marked as Exhibit D-1 is attached and incorporated into the Agreement by this reference. Effective as of the date of this Amendatory Agreement as written on the City's signature page below, Exhibit D-1 will replace and supersede Exhibit D in all respects.
- **3.** Subparagraph D. (1) of Article 7, entitled "<u>Maximum Contract Amount</u>", is amended by deleting and replacing it with the following:

"D. Maximum Contract Amount:

(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of the Agreement, the City's maximum payment obligation will not exceed **One Million Seven Hundred Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Nine Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,712,569.00)** (the "Maximum Contract Amount"). The City is not obligated to execute an Agreement or any amendments for any further services, including any services performed by Contractor beyond that specifically described in Exhibit A. Any services performed beyond those in

Exhibit A are performed at Contractor's risk and without authorization under the Agreement.

- **4.** Subparagraph F of Article 7, entitled "**Non-Federal Share Match**" is amended by deleting and replacing it with the following:
- "F. Non-Federal Share Match. The Contractor will provide its proportionate share of non-federal funds through cash or in-kind, fairly evaluated, contributions. The phrase "fairly evaluated" referenced in the preceding sentence will be interpreted in accordance with 45 C.F.R. Part 74.23 and/or 45 C.F.R. Part 92.24 as well as any other applicable federal regulations pertaining to match and cost sharing requirements for the Head Start program. Contractor's contribution under this Agreement will be Four Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand One Hundred Forty-Two Dollars and Twenty Five Cents (\$428,142.25) as set forth in more detail in Exhibit B and B-1, as applicable. The Contractor will report in writing to the City, within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of receipt thereof, any cash or other funds to be applied toward the nonfederal match that Contractor receives. Contractor will be responsible for documenting and maintaining accurate records to the reasonable satisfaction of the City both Contractors' non-federal share contributions and the contributions of Subdelegates and any Vendor designated by the Director. Such contributions will be recorded on each expenditure variance report and in written reports forwarded to the City on a monthly basis. Each monthly report will list all contributions provided by Contractor and/or its Subdelegates and/or any Vendor for each respective guarter and will list the total amount of contributions made as of the date of the monthly report. The City reserves the right to withhold, adjust and/or reallocate subsequent Grant funds whenever it determines that Contractor's current spending is inconsistent with amounts and categories listed on Exhibit B and B-1, as applicable, the purposes identified in Exhibit A, or if reports of nonfederal share contributions, in whole or in part, are not provided by Contractor on a timely basis."
- **5.** This Amendatory Agreement is not effective or binding on the City until it has been fully executed by all required signatories of the City and County of Denver, and if required by Charter, approved by the City Council.
- **6.** Except as amended here, the Agreement is affirmed and ratified in each and every particular.

Budget Narrative Cost-of-living Adjustment (COLA) 2016/2017

The total dollar amount of \$29,848 will be spent to give all Head Start staff a 1.8 percent salary increase and to pay for corresponding payroll taxes and fringe benefits. The salary schedule for all Head Start employees will be permanently adjusted to reflect the 1.8 percent salary increase.

Non-federal Share

The Non-Federal Share to be matched against the COLA funds totals \$7,462 and will include the following resources:

- Classroom and field trip volunteering
- 2. Family literacy sheets
- 3. Translation services
- 4. Painting and maintenance of the facilities
- Cleaning and maintenance of the grounds
- 6. Donated rent
- 7. Occupancy costs not paid by Head Start

- 8. Grants used to support the Head Start program including the Rose Grant
- 9. Board of Directors' volunteer time to attend meetings
- Parents and community members' time to attend policy committee meetings
- 11. Administrative assistance
- 12. Services, i.e. dental, vision screenings
