



#### The NCS & Denver

- Participant in The NCS annually since 2002
- Random scientific sample of 6,050 households
  - 1,254 returned surveys; 22% response rate
  - ±3% margin of error




#### **2016 Benchmark Comparisons**

- Lower than national benchmark
















What impact, if any, do you think the economy will have on your family income in the next 6 months?












