interior renovation primarily consisting of adding the appropriate number of restrooms is required to comply with the Denver Building Code for this new Occupancy Classification.

To allow the facility to be used for its intended purpose as soon as possible, multiple City agencies have worked together to temporarily provide the required restrooms in the facility. In October of 2017 the Denver Building Department issued a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO) for the facility, allowing for the immediate use of the space for its intended purpose.

The City has made a commitment to complete the construction of permanent restrooms in the facility by April 2018. In the summer of 2017 the City procured the services of an architectural and engineering team to produce the design documents required for the changes. The design team completed those documents in October 2017. To meet the City's committed construction schedule, the only procurement method available within the City is via the Public Works On-Call Construction Contract. However, this on-call contract has a work order limit of \$450,000. Initial cost estimates indicate the cost of construction will be in the range of \$1,250,000 - \$1,500,000. The project team, which consists primarily of Real Estate and Public Works, has had multiple discussions with the City Attorney's Office regarding the constraints of this project. The City Attorney's Office determined the project to be a City Emergency, and supports the project team's request to amend the On-Call Construction Contract work order limit, allowing for the competitive bidding of the construction documents to three on-call general contractors.

Public Works has issued construction bid documents to three on-call general contractors, and their bids will be submitted on November 17, 2017. This ordinance requests amending the work order limit for this specific project, which has been deemed a City Emergency, to \$1,800,000. The request exceeds the estimated cost of construction to allow for project contingencies, which may include a higher construction bid than anticipated, and to address unforeseen conditions that will arise during the construction and renovation of the existing facility.

We are initiating the ordinance at this time so that construction can begin on January 2, 2018. This construction start date enables the project to be completed in time to meet the City's schedule commitment, bettering the wellbeing of those who currently reside in the facility.
