


What is the Comprehensive Plan?

- Holistic, long-term vision for the city
- City Charter & DRMC task CPD with preparation
- Current plan adopted by City Council in 2000
 - Adopted supplements: Blueprint, Game Plan & small area plans
- Accomplishments from Comp Plan 2000:
 - Integrated land use & transportation plans (Blueprint Denver)
 - Guide growth to mixed-use areas served by transit while respecting Denver neighborhoods








Denver's Current Comp Plan -

Challenges Outdated – 17 years old

- Best practice is update every 5-10 yrs
- Considerable change since 2000
- Not being used by most departments/agencies
- Long, dense, and not user-friendly







Proposed: New Denveright Comp Plan

- Reflect the current voice of Denver
- Memorialize key goals advancing vision elements
- Provide a framework connecting the city's plans
- Refer to other plans for specifics
- Format in a shorter, more user-friendly document
- Support regular reporting & updating

Proposed approach would <u>not</u>:

- Change what plans are adopted
- Establish <u>specific</u> strategies or actions
- Set priorities across goals









COMPREHENSIVE PLAN



VISION FRAMEWORK

The comp plan establishes a vision framework and broad goals to tie together the city's plans and policies



CITYWIDE PLANS

- Generated by multiple departments/ agencies
- Contain detailed goals, objectives and strategies
- Relate back to the vision framework and advance the goals established in the comprehensive plan

Example: Well-Connected, Safe and Accessible Places

EXAMPLE GOAL: Focus higher-intensity growth in walkable mixed-use centers and along highfrequency transit corridors Denver will promote land use policies that support density in transit-rich areas and advance a multimodal transportation system with a network of high-capacity transit corridors
