## A BILL <br> For an ordinance renaming a portion of Havana Way as Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

WHEREAS, this portion of land was previously dedicated as Havana Way by Ordinance No. 127, Series of 1954 and recorded at Reception Number 1954063906 in the Office of the Clerk and Recorder, City and County of Denver;

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. The Council hereby approves the renaming of the following described portion of Havana Way to Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

## PARCEL DESCRIPTION ROW NO. 2017-VACA-0000011-002:

A part of Havana Way as described in Book 7504 at Page 176 in the Clerk and Recorder's Office of the City and County of Denver, State of Colorado, being a part of the South Half of Section 26, Township 3 South, Range 67 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, City and County of Denver, State of Colorado, more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING at the South Quarter Corner of said Section 26;
thence North $89^{\circ} 39^{\prime} 23^{\prime \prime}$ East, along the southerly line of said Southeast Quarter of Section 26, a distance of 590.15 feet to the southwest corner of said Havana Way as described in Book 7504 at Page 176;
thence along the westerly line of said Havana Way as described in Book 7504 at Page 176 the following two (2) courses:

1. North $00^{\circ} 17^{\prime} 27^{\prime \prime}$ West a distance of 446.04 feet to a point of curve;
2. along the arc of a curve to the left having a radius of 624.10 feet, a central angle of $37^{\circ} 31^{\prime} 25^{\prime \prime}$, an arc length of 408.73 feet and whose chord bears North $19^{\circ} 0^{\prime} 3^{\prime} 09^{\prime \prime}$ West a distance of 401.46 feet to the northeast corner of Lot 1, Block 2, Stapleton Filing No. 40 recorded at Reception Number 2013109191 in said Clerk and Recorder's Office and the POINT OF BEGINNING;
thence along the southerly lines of said Havana Way as described in Book 7504 at Page 176 the following five (5) courses:
3. along the arc of a curve to the left having a radius of 624.10 feet, a central angle of $58^{\circ} 18^{\prime} 03^{\prime \prime}$, an arc length of 635.05 feet and whose chord bears North $66^{\circ} 57^{\prime} 53^{\prime \prime}$ West a distance of 608.00 feet;
4. South $83^{\circ} 53^{\prime} 05^{\prime \prime}$ West a distance of 756.60 feet to a point of curve;
5. along the arc of a curve to the right having a radius of 1196.00 feet, a central angle of
$50^{\circ} 24^{\prime} 41^{\prime \prime}$, an arc length of 1052.29 feet and whose chord bears North $70^{\circ} 54^{\prime} 35^{\prime \prime}$ West a distance of 1018.68 feet;
6. North $45^{\circ} 42^{\prime} 144^{\prime \prime}$ West a distance of 972.30 feet to a point of curve;
7. along the arc of a curve to the right having a radius of 724.10 feet, a central angle of $7^{\circ} 16^{\prime} 10^{\prime \prime}$, an arc length of 91.87 feet and whose chord bears North $42^{\circ} 04^{\prime} 09^{\prime \prime}$ West a distance of 91.81 feet to the southeasterly line of a parcel of land described in Book 276 at Page 565 of the Adams County Clerk and Recorder's Office;
thence North $26^{\circ} 10^{\prime} 58^{\prime \prime}$ East, along said southeasterly line of said parcel of land described in Book 276 at Page 565 of the Adams County Clerk and Recorder's Office, a distance of 112.76 feet to the northerly line of said Havana Way and a point of non-tangent curve;
thence along said northerly lines of Havana Way the following five (5) courses;
8. along the arc of a curve to the left having a radius of 624.10 feet, a central angle of $11^{\circ} 42^{\prime} 41^{\prime \prime}$, an arc length of 127.57 feet and whose chord bears South $39^{\circ} 50^{\prime} 54^{\prime \prime}$ East a distance of 127.35 feet;
9. South $45^{\circ} 42^{\prime} 144^{\prime \prime}$ East a distance of 972.30 feet to a point of curve;
10. along the arc of a curve to the left having a radius of 1096.00 feet, a central angle of $50^{\circ} 24^{\prime} 41^{\prime \prime}$, an arc length of 964.31 feet and whose chord bears South $70^{\circ} 54^{\prime} 35^{\prime \prime}$ East a distance of 933.50 feet;
11. North $83^{\circ} 53^{\prime} 05$ " East a distance of 756.60 feet to a point of curve;
12. along the arc of a curve to the right having a radius of 724.10 feet, a central angle of $74^{\circ} 39^{\prime \prime} 58^{\prime \prime}$, an arc length of 943.62 feet and whose chord bears South $58^{\circ} 46^{\prime} 56^{\prime \prime}$ East a distance of 878.26 feet to a point that bears South $56^{\circ} 55^{\prime} 06$ " East from the point of beginning;
thence North $56^{\circ} 55^{\prime} 06$ " West a distance of 215.91 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING.
Containing 364,482 square feet or 8.367 acres, more or less.
BASIS OF BEARING: Bearings are based on the southerly line of the Southeast Quarter of Section 26, Township 3 South, Range 67 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, City and County of Denver, State of Colorado, bearing North $89^{\circ} 39^{\prime} 23^{\prime \prime}$ East based on NAD 83/92 Colorado Central Zone State Plane Coordinates. The South Quarter corner of said Section 26 is a found $3-1 / 4$ " aluminum cap in a monument box Stamped: URS CORP PLS 20683. The Southeast corner of said Section 26 is a found 3" brass cap in a monument box Stamped: City of Aurora 16419.

Section 2. That the real property described in Section 1 hereof shall henceforth be known as Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.
