**Scope of work:** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is mandating that R-22 refrigerant be phased out with a complete ban of its use in January 2020.

This project consists of, but is not limited to the following project elements, all within the Central Utility Plant (CUP):

Remove three (3) chillers and replace with six (6) new chillers. Procuring, receiving and installing specified equipment in the CUP as follows:

- 1. Six (6) electrically driven, variable speed centrifugal chillers and associated 4160V variable frequency drives (VFDs).
- 2. Eight (8) variable speed, vertical turbine condenser water pumps and associated 4160V VFDs. A limited number of existing pump VFDs will be repurposed and utilized for this project, so not all pumps may receive a new drive.
- 3. One (1) variable speed chilled water primary pump and its associated 480V VFD.
- 4. Two (2) process cooling pumps to serve new and existing air handling units (AHUs).
- 5. Two (2) chilled water AHUs.
- 6. One (1) packaged direct expansion heating, ventilation and air conditioning rooftop unit.
- 7. Supporting electrical, structural, life safety, instrumentation and controls equipment.
