12 13	amendment to the Charter of the City and County of Denver concerning the qualifications for lateral hires to the Denver Police Department		
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:		
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17	Section 1. There is hereby submitted to the properly qualified and registered electors of the		
18	City and County of Denver for their approval or rejection at a special municipal election to be		
19	conducted at the same time and in conjunction with the state general election to be held in the City		
20	and County of Denver on November 6, 2018, a proposed amendment to the Charter of the City and		
21	County of Denver, as follows:		
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23	Effective upon publication and filing with the Secretary of State pursuant to the		
24	Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado, the following sections of Article IV of		
25	the 2002 Charter of the City and County of Denver shall be and are hereby amended to		
26	read as follows:		
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28	Amend Part 3 of Article IX by deleting the language stricken and adding the language		
29	underlined to read as follows:		
30	§ 9.3.11 – Eligible registers, for original appointment and promotional appointment		
31	requisition and certification.		
32	(E) Original appointment. The Commission shall establish rules to provide for the requisition		
33	by the Manager of Safety, and the certification to the Manager of Safety, of applicants for		
34	original appointment.		
35	(i) Appointment of certified peace officer <u>and firefighter</u> with <del>a minimum of three</del>		

years patrol experience of firefighter with a minimum of three years full-time 1 2 firefighting experience. An applicant to the Classified Service of the Denver Police 3 Department who is currently certified as a peace officer and who has a minimum of three 4 vears of patrol experience as a law enforcement officer may receive original appointment in 5 the Police Department upon meeting all qualification and examination standards 6 established by the Commission and the Department of Safety, upon being certified to the Manager of Safety, and upon receiving written approval of the Chief of the Police 7 8 Department and the Manager of Safety. An applicant to the Classified Service of the Denver Fire Department who has a minimum of three years of full-time firefighting 9 10 experience may receive original appointment in the Fire Department upon meeting all 11 qualification and examination standards established by the Commission and the 12 Department of Safety, upon being certified to the Manager of Safety, and upon receiving 13 written approval of the Chief of the Fire Department and the Manager of Safety. (ii) 14 Appointment of an active Reserve Police Officer. An active Reserve Police Officer of the 15 Denver Police Department who has met all of the qualifications and requirements of the Denver Police Department reserve officer training program and has been designated a 16 17 Reserve Officer may receive original appointment in the Police Department upon meeting 18 all qualification and examination standards established by the Commission and the 19 Department of Safety, upon being certified to the Manager of Safety, and upon receiving 20 written approval of the Chief of the Police Department and the Manager of Safety. An 21 applicant to the Classified Service of the Denver Police Department who is currently 22 certified as a Colorado peace officer or out-of-state equivalent, and has a minimum of 2 23 years' experience on the date of application (not including time employed as a 24 corrections/detention officer), excluding time served during prior police academy training, 25 may at the discretion of the Chief of Police or designee, start the Denver Police Academy at 26 the rate of pay for Police Officer 2nd grade. The recruit, after successful completion of the Denver Police Academy, followed by continued employment as a Denver police officer for a 27 28 period of (9) months of service (following graduation), shall become a Police Officer 1st 29 grade at the start of the following pay period, regardless of the completion date in the 9th 30 month. 31 An applicant to the Classified Service of the Denver Police Department who is currently 32 certified as a Colorado peace officer or out-of-state equivalent and has a minimum of 4 33 years' experience on the date of application (not including time employed as a 34 corrections/detention officer), excluding time served in a prior police academy, may at the 35 discretion of the Chief of Police or designee, start the Denver Police Academy at the rate of 36 37 pay for Police Officer 1st grade. The Chief of Police will evaluate applicants with prior law enforcement experience and 38 peace officer certification on a case-by-case basis in assessing and determining suitability 39 40 for hiring at an elevated pay grade. An applicant to the Classified Service of the Denver Fire Department who has a minimum of 41 three years of full-time firefighting experience may receive original appointment in the Fire 42 Department upon meeting all qualification and examination standards established by the 43 Commission and the Department of Safety, upon being certified to the Manager of Safety, 44 and upon receiving written approval of the Chief of the Fire Department and the Manager of 45 46 Safety.

- 1 These appointments shall have no impact regarding required time served in the Denver Fire 2 or Police Departments for the purpose of seniority and promotional testing requirements of 3 the Civil Service Commission.
- The standards set forth are separate from City Charter 9.5.5 (A)(B) and 9.6.6 (A)(B)(C)(D)
  which addresses pay standards for those who do not qualify as a Lateral Firefighter or
  Lateral Police Officer.
- Section 2. The voting machines and paper ballot for said election shall carry the following
  designation, which shall be the title and submission clause:
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REFERRED QUESTION

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- Shall the Charter of the City and County of Denver be amended to promote greater
  flexibility in the hiring of lateral recruits for classified service in the Denver Police
  Department?
- Section 3. Each elector voting at the election and wishing to for or against the amendment shall indicate the elector's choice by depressing the appropriate counter of the voting machine which indicates the word "YES" or the word "NO", or by appropriate marking upon paper ballots when used.
- Section 4. The proper officials of the City and County of Denver as are charged with duties relating to the election shall, before the election, issue such calls, make such certifications and publications, give such notices, make such appointments, and do all such other acts and things in connection with the submission of this Charter amendment to the registered electors of the City and County of Denver at the election as are required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.
- Section 5. The ballots cast at such election shall be canvassed and the results ascertained,
  determined, and certified in accordance with the requirements of the Constitution and laws of the
  State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.
- Section 6. If any section, paragraph, clause, or other portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance shall not be affected.
