




Background

- City of Denver and CDOT IGA
 - Nov. 1, 2017 to Dec. 31, 2018
- CDOT Package of Improvements: \$2.3M
- CCD Package of Improvements: \$1.45M
- CREA Results provided door-to-door outreach
- Energy Outreach Colorado coordinating work
- Mile High Youth Corps, Energy Resource Center, and Groundwork Denver providing assessments and installations
 - All participating homes received a comprehensive, personalized assessment

Home Improvements Video



Doors and Windows

- Exterior Doors (Denver)
- Fiberglass doors with wood core

- Windows (Denver and CDOT)
- Two options: interior storm windows or external windows
- Residents choose one or both, depending on home assessment and personal preference



Windows

Interior Sound Dampening Windows (CDOT)

- Interior sound dampening windows manufactured by sound proofing company that specifically manufactures windows for high-transit areas and home studio applications
- Custom-sized; and the program installed an average of 5 per home
- 3" gap between external and internal panes provides maximum sound dampening and decibel reduction (up to 50 decibels depending on conditions)

New Double Hung Windows (Denver)

- Double-paned, Energy Star
- Between 7-8 per home
- Custom-ordered for each home; maximizes air and dust sealing
- Sound reduction ranges between 26 to 32 decibels

Cooling and HVAC

Portable or window-mounted A/C units (CDOT)

- Allows residents to stay comfortable with windows closed
- Includes \$25/mo. utility credit applied directly to Xcel bill for duration of Central 70 construction
- Credit begins on August billing cycle

HVAC (Denver)

- New, efficient furnaces provided when needed to replace extremely old, leaking and/or inefficient systems
- New whole-house air conditioning systems provided, depending on home assessment



Safety and Energy Efficiency Measures

- Smoke detectors (CDOT)
- Carbon monoxide detectors (CDOT)
- Programmable thermostat (CDOT)
- Furnace filter (CDOT)
 - Filters dust from interior air exchange
- Low-flow plumbing fixtures (EOC)
- ► LED light bulbs (EOC)
- Energy Star refrigerators (EOC)



Insulation and Weatherization

- Attic Insulation (CDOT)
- Cellulose insulation: denser option that maximizes sound reduction
- Provides better insulation than in many new homes
- Provides Energy Star rating of R49 or better
- Caulking and weather stripping along doors and windows (CDOT)



Safety Concerns

Safety Concerns have been identified in 28 percent of homes

- Gas leaks/CO leaks
- Holes in roof
- Severe plumbing leaks
- Knob and tube electrical
- Old, failing and non-existent furnaces
- Old, failing and leaking water heaters
