## DPD Air One Replacement Purchase Overview

## Overview

The Denver Police Department is in the process of purchasing a new Bell 407GXP helicopter to replace the current helicopter.

DPD's current Air One Helicopter is 20 years old. The recommended operational lifespan is 15 years. Due to its age, Air One frequently requires unplanned maintenance.

The total cost of the aircraft and law enforcement customizations is \$5,108,537.

The total amount to be financed is \$4,108,537 after contribution of 2018 appropriated funding (\$500,000) and trade-in of the current asset, estimated at \$500,000 with final value TBD.



## **Equipment Detail**

This purchase will provide DPD with a modern aircraft that will be safer, and more reliable. Below is a highlighted list of improvements the new aircraft will provide:

- Improved cockpit safety items
- Decreased maintenance expenses
- Night vision to increase operational capability
- Infrared will decrease the amount of time to apprehend a suspect
