



Scope/Milestones

1. Establish TDM goals


- Review existing plans, internal stakeholder input, estimate realistic impacts
- 2. Review applicable peer and academic research to identify potential strategies and incentives
- 3. Conduct stakeholder engagement
- 4. Develop draft recommendations
 - Create draft web-based TDM pool
 - Confirm with public stakeholders
- 5. Create deliverables and final plans
 - Create final web-based TDM tool
 - Propose necessary regulatory framework
 - Manage ongoing administrative process
