# Colorado Coalition for the Homeless – Denver Street Outreach Collaborative (DSOC)

- 2016 amendment for \$1,000,000
- Administers collaborative comprised of three agencies:
- Colorado Coalition for the Homeless
- Urban Peak
- > St. Francis Center

#### DENVER'S ROAD HOM

- Provide street outreach and housing placement services to homeless youth and adults.
- Assist with acquiring benefits and other services to address other identified needs.
- DSOC has housed and/or reunified 2965 individuals, families and youth in the last 10 years

### Colorado Coalition for the Homeless – 16th St.

- 2016 amendment for \$325,000
- Permanent Supportive Housing for 60 chronically homeless individuals
- Contract provides mental health treatment and on going case management for 60 residents
- Residents in this program retain housing at a rate of 90% or higher after 1 year



# St Francis Center – Extended Hours and WHI transportation

- 2016 amendment for \$350,000
- Extends hours of operation allowing St. Francis to rema open from 2pm to 6pm each day.
- Also allows St. Francis Center to see an average of 402 individuals a day in 2015 during these extended hours
- Provides evening and morning van transportation to churches and provide shelter for an average of 25 wome a night



- Busco, Inc. Overflow Shelter Transportation
- 2016 amendment for \$550,000
- This contract provides bus transportation to and from overflow shelters
- Each bus runs approximately 3 trips morning and evenin at a cost of \$830 a day
- 2016 amount will only cover men through April Womer transportation is budgeted through 2016
