

Proclamation No. CP16-0158 In Support of National Native HIV/AIDS Awareness Day & National Women and Girls HIV/AIDS Awareness Day

WHEREAS, approximately, 1.1 million Americans are living with HIV and more than 50,000 become infected with HIV every year; 26% are between the ages of 13 and 24; female youth accounted for nearly 2,000 of all youth living with HIV; and

WHEREAS, according to the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, at the end of 2014, more than 12,900 people were reported to be living with HIV in the State of Colorado; and

WHEREAS, HIV and AIDS has affected the City and County of Denver more than any other area in the State of Colorado, reporting the most persons living with the disease, most HIV or AIDS-related deaths, and 40% of new HIV infections in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the continued spread of HIV in the American Indian and Alaska Native communities poses a significant risk to the public health and well-being of these communities; they had the 3rd highest rate of new HIV infections in Colorado in 2014; and

WHEREAS, when compared to other ethnic groups, American Indians and Alaska Natives are ranked 5th in estimated rates of HIV diagnoses and have poorer survival rates after an HIV diagnosis; HIV infection was the 9th leading cause of death among American Indian and Alaska Native youth aged 25 to 34 in 2010; and

WHEREAS, approximately 1 in 4 people living with HIV in the U.S. are women; cases disproportionally affect African American and Latina women, who represent 28% of all women in the U.S., but account for 80% of HIV cases among women; and

WHEREAS, the City and County of Denver recognizes the continued work to bring HIV and AIDS awareness by groups such as: Café Cultura, Children's Hospital Immunodeficiency Program, Sisters of Color United for Education, Colorado Organization for Latina Opportunity and Reproductive Rights, Denver Indian Center, Denver Indian Health and Family Services, Lakota Way Healing Center, Sister Nations Color Guard, Branching Seedz of Resistance, University of Denver Graduate School of Social Work, and Servicios de La Raza.

NOW THERFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. That Denver City Council proclaims March 10, 2016 to be known as National Women and Girls HIV/AIDS Awareness Day and March 20, 2016 as National Native HIV/AIDS Awareness Day.

Section 2. That the Clerk of the City and County of Denver shall attest and affix the seal of the City and County of Denver to this proclamation and that copies be transmitted to Café Cultura and Servicios de La Raza.
