What is Graywater?

- Definitions
 - Black Water sewage or wastewater containing food scraps or water flushed from toilets
 - Graywater wastewater collected from bathroom and laundry room sinks, bathtubs, showers, and laundry machines within residential, commercial, or industrial buildings or institutional facilities for the purpose of being put to beneficial uses.
 - Recycled Water sewage or wastewater that has been treated to remove solids and impurities, and used in for irrigation, to recharge ground water aquifers, and to meet commercial and industrial water needs.
 - Potable Water water which is suitable for drinking and food preparation

 - City Plumbing Code
 - ► Graywater Ordinance and Rules and Regulations

Why Are We Here / Next Steps

- Authorize a <u>voluntary</u> program allowing beneficial reuse of graywater in Denver
 - Graywater ordinance adoption by Council
 - Authorize Board of Environmental Health to develop rules and regulations and design criteria
 - Give CPD and DEH authority to implement a City graywater program
 - Define legal geographic extent of program
 - Rules and regulations and design criteria adoption by BEH
 - Program implementation by CPH and DEH


Why Reuse Graywater?

- City's 2020 sustainability goals
 - Community goals
 - ▶ Reduce per capita use of potable water in Denver by 22% over a 2001 baseline
 - ▶ Keep the rate of increase of consumption of potable water below the rate of population growth
- The Colorado Water Plan (2015)
 - Achieve 400,000 acre-feet of municipal and industrial water conservation by 2050


Allowed Graywater Sources & Uses

- Sources
 - Wastewater collected from:
 - ▶ Bathroom and laundry room sinks
 - Bathtubs and showers
 - Washing machines
- Uses
 - Toilet flushing
 - Subsurface (underground) irrigation


Allowed Uses – Subsurface Irrigation
