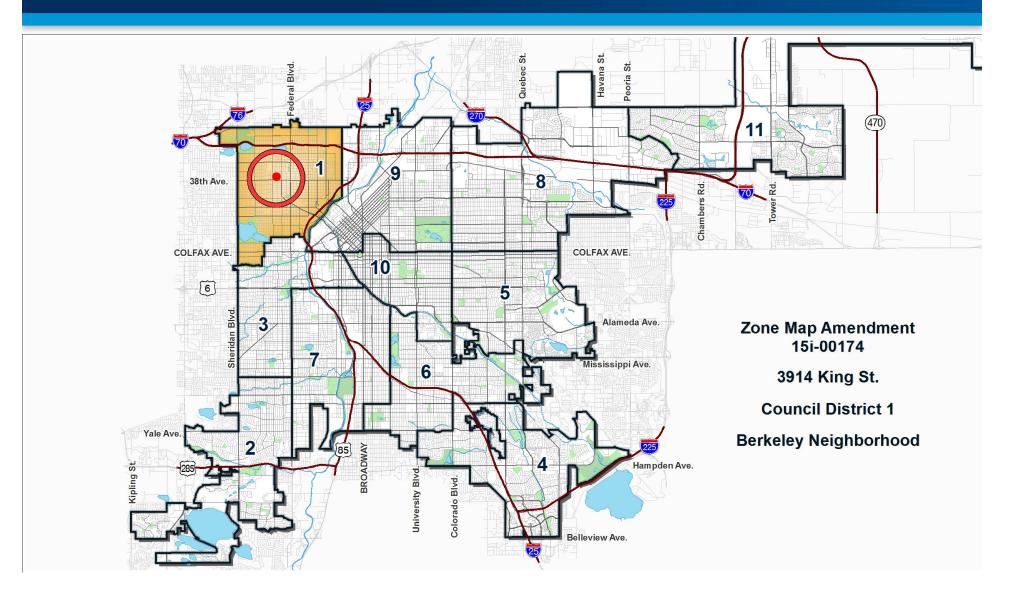

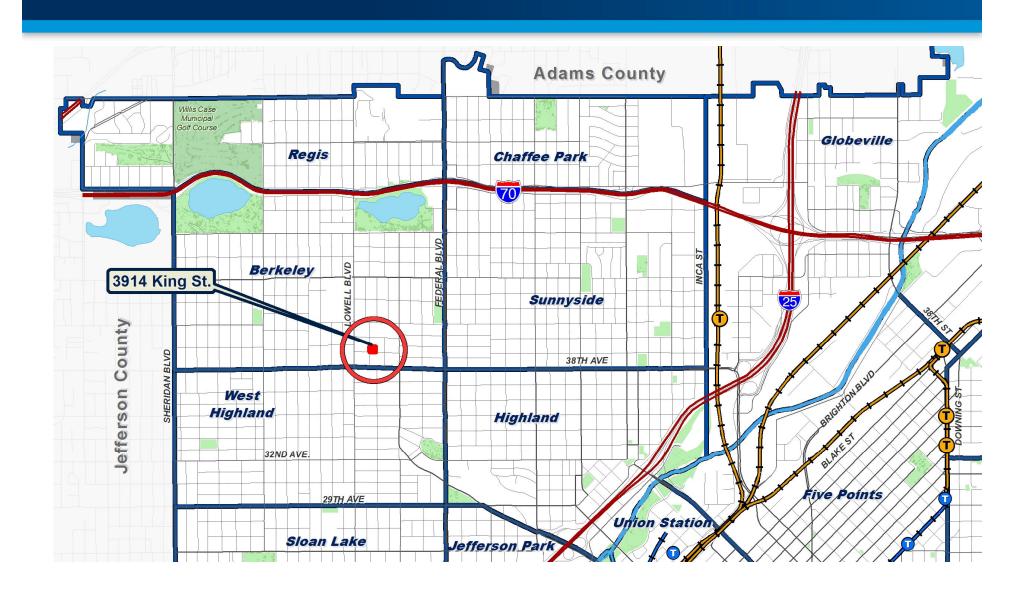

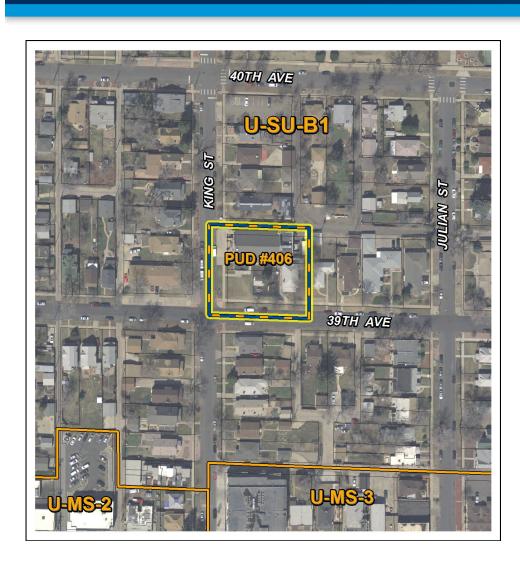








Existing Context – Zoning

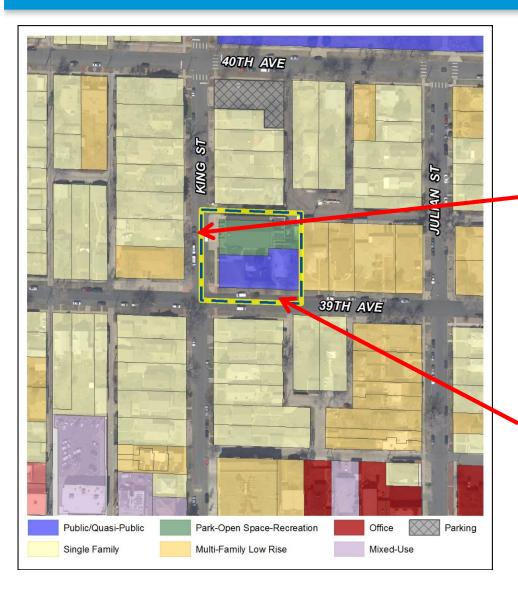
