CB18-0943 3 SERIES OF 2018 COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE: Finance & Governance 4 A BILL 5 For an ordinance designating a certain property in Adams County as being 6 required for public use and authorizing use and acquisition thereof by 7 negotiation or through condemnation proceedings of fee simple, easement and 8 other interests, including any rights and interests related or appurtenant to 9 10 properties as needed for the National Western Center Project. 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER: 13 **Section 1.** That Council designates the following property situated in Adams County and 14 State of Colorado as being needed for public uses and purposes by the City and County of Denver, 15 a home rule city and municipal corporation of the State of Colorado: 16 LEGAL DESCRIPTION 17 A PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN THE NW1/4NE1/4 AND IN THE SW1/4NE1/4 OF SECTION 14, 18 TOWNSHIP 3 SOUTH, RANGE 68 WEST OF THE 6TH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, MORE PARTICULARLY 19 **DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:** 20 21 COMMENCING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SAID NW1/4NE1/4 OF SAID SECTION 14. 22 THENCE S01°14'30" E ALONG THE WEST LINE OF THE SAID NW1/4NE1/4, A DISTANCE OF 957.0 23 FEET; 24 THENCE EAST, A DISTANCE OF 30.00 FEET TO THE TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING; FROM SAID 25 TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING, 26 THENCE S01°14'30" E, PARALLEL WITH THE WEST LINE OF SAID NW1/4NE1/4 AND SW1/4NE1/4 27 OF SAID SECTION 14, A DISTANCE OF 744.9 FEET TO A POINT 8.5 FEET DISTANT FROM AND 28 MEASURED AT RIGHT ANGLES TO THE CENTER LINE OF THE CHICAGO BURLINGTON AND 29 QUINCY RAILROAD COMPANY SPUR TRACK: 30 THENCE S18°51'30" E, PARALLEL WITH AND 8.5 FEET DISTANT FROM THE CENTERLINE OF SAID 31 SPUR TRACK, A DISTANCE OF 32.53 FEET TO A POINT ON THE NORTHWESTERLY RIGHT OF WAY 32 LINE OF NORTHWESTERN TERMINAL RAILROAD COMPANY; 33 THENCE NORTHEASTERLY ALONG SAID NORTHWESTERLY RIGHT OF WAY LINE ON A CURVE TO 34 THE RIGHT HAVING A RADIUS OF 1482.7 FEET A DISTANCE OF 773.8 FEET TO A POINT OF 35 TANGENT. 36 THE LONG CHORD OF SAID CURVE BEARS N26°17'30" E A DISTANCE OF 764.9 FEET: THENCE N41°19' E ALONG SAID NORTHWESTERLY RIGHT OF WAY LINE A DISTANCE OF 119.5 37 38 FEET; 39 THENCE WEST A DISTANCE OF 444.76 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING. 40 COUNTY OF ADAMS, STATE OF COLORADO. 41

Section 2. That the Council finds and determines that property interests in these properties are needed and required for the following public uses and public purposes: relocation required by the National Western Center project of rail lines, rail operations, and rail maintenance facilities serving the Denver and Adams County communities.

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Section 3. That Council authorizes the Mayor, including his duly authorized representatives, in accordance with applicable federal, state, and City laws and rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto, to acquire the needed property interests, including, but not limited to, fee title, permanent easements, temporary easements, fixtures, licenses, permits, improvements (including without limitation, general outdoor advertising devices, buildings, and access points) and any other rights, interests, and appurtenances thereto, including the taking of all actions necessary to do so without further action by City Council, such as conducting negotiations, executing all related agreements, and making all necessary payments; to take actions required by law before instituting condemnation proceedings; to allow the temporary use of City-owned land; and to convey and transfer City-owned land, including remnants.

Section 4. That if for the property interest set forth above, the interested parties do not agree upon the compensation to be paid for the needed property interests, the owner or owners of the property are incapable of consenting, the name or residence of any owner is unknown, or any of the owners are non-residents of the State, then the City Attorney of the City and County of Denver, upon the Mayor's direction, is authorized and empowered to exercise the City and County of Denver's eminent domain powers by instituting and, as necessary, prosecuting to conclusion proceedings under Article Title 38, Colorado Revised Statutes, to acquire needed property interests upon, through, over, under and along the above-described property as necessary for the purposes set forth in Section 2 above.

Section 5. That the Council finds and determines that the Department of Real Estate and/or other agencies may find the need to alter the legal descriptions of the properties referred to in this Ordinance and may continue to do so in order to meet the needs of the Project. Council authorizes the Mayor, including his duly authorized representatives, in accordance with applicable federal, state, and City laws and rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto, to acquire the property as the legal descriptions are altered in accordance with the means authorized in this Ordinance.

Section 6. That the Council hereby finds and determines that to improve the safety and operation of pedestrians, bicycles and vehicles in the vicinity of the Project, it may be necessary to rebuild, modify, remove, and relocate existing access points to streets located in the vicinity of the Project.

Section 7. That the City Council hereby finds and determines that the Project is necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the public.
