- The Denver Health and Hospital Authority was formed as a state authority under state statute in 1997 to operate the former Denver General Hospital.
- City/County of Denver adopted a Charter amendment in 1996 to replace the Department of Health and Hospitals with the Department of Environmental Health, which retained the authority and regulatory powers of the local public health agency.
- Annual Operating Agreement outlines services
 Authority provides to the City and City provides to
 Authority.



Structure of Agreement

- Services are divided into Core Services and Non-Core Services.
 - Core services include the Medically Indigent Payment,
 Emergency Medical Services, Public Health, Denver CARES,
 prisoner medical services at DHHA, etc.
 - Non-Core services include child welfare, jail medical services, marijuana public health impact monitoring and communication, etc.
- City also provides services to DHHA including payroll, legal, radio replacement, fuel, 911 call taker, etc.



2019 Operating Agreement

Highlights of Key Changes to Core and Appendix A

- Public Health Services
 - Added Chief Medical Officer scope of work to Public Health Services
 - Added a permanent Director of Preparedness, Informatics and Epidemiology (0.60 FTE).
- Continued funding for Case Coordinator position for high utilizers at Denver CARES.
- Continued Substance Treatment Services funding to backfill for lost grant funding.
- Adjusted budget for Correctional Care to reflect actual expenses. No adjustment to scope of work.
- Updating of reporting and performance metrics for most Appendix A sections.

Highlights of Key Changes to Appendix B

 Mental Health Services Expansion for Jail Medical Services.

3 Discontinued Sections:

- Substance Treatment and Education
 Program (no 2019 funding)
- Child Welfare (Moved to separate Contract)

2019 Contract Budget

The total proposed 2019 contract amount is \$64,520,885 for services to DHHA and receipt of funds in the amount of approximately \$4,382,422 for City services provided to DHHA.
