# What is Single-Use Plastic?

- Plastic Bags
- Straws
- Water and Soda Bottles
- ▶ Food Packaging
- Plastic Cutlery



# Trends

- U.S. cities predominantly restrict SUP use with plastic bag bans
- Cities are beginning bans on straws and cutlery
- Worldwide trend is to ban all SUPs



### Current State of SUP Laws

#### Plastic Bag Bans

- Notable Cities
  - Seattle
  - Portland
  - Boston
  - Aspen
  - ► Telluride
- ▶ California and Hawaii

#### Fees for Use of Bags

- Often used in conjunction with ban on plastic bags
- Fees typically charged for using a nonreusable bag
  - But some cities tax reusable bags as well
- ▶ Usually Between 5 and 20 cents

# Colorado-Specific Issues


#### State Preemption

- ► C.R.S. § 25-17-104
- "No unit of local government shall require or prohibit the use or sale of specific types of plastic materials or products or restrict or mandate containers, packaging, or labeling for any consumer products."
- 5 cities in Colorado have banned plastic bags since the statute was enacted. Zero lawsuits initiated challenging bans under this statute.

#### TABOR

Aspen avoided TABOR by claiming that their bag charge was a "fee" and not a "tax" so TABOR wouldn't be involved. Court found in favor of Aspen so TABOR wasn't invoked.

# Three Methods Used in Colorado



#### Boulder

- Passed in 2012
- 10-cent fee on plastic or paper bag use



#### Aspen

- Passed in 2011
- Bags are banned. Paper Bags have a 20-cent fee



#### Crested Butte

- Passed in 2016
- Bags are banned. Paper bags are not taxed but must be made from 40% recycled content and be 100% recyclable



# Are Bans Effective?

- STATISTICS ARE UNRELIABLE ON AMOUNT OF PLASTIC BAG REDUCTION
- TWO CALIFORNIA STUDIES
  FOUND PROMISING DATA
   REGARDING REUSABLE
   BAG USE
- WASHINGTON, D.C. HAS EARNED \$10 MILLION SINCE 2010 ON BAG FEES
- BOULDER HAS EARNED \$1 MILLION SINCE 2013
