17	(5)	Filing of petitions; determination of s	ufficiency; protest and hearings. After	
18		signatures have been obtained, the	petitioners' committee shall file the	
19		completed petition with the clerk and r	ecorder by the close of business on a	
20		normal business day. All related petition	sections shall be filed at the same time.	
21		The clerk and recorder shall record the	same and shall hold the petition for a	
22		period of twenty-five (25) days, during	which time the clerk and recorder shall	
23		determine whether the petition is signe	d by the requisite number of registered	
24		electors; except that if the petitioners' co	ommittee files a completed petition or an	
25		addendum during the time that the cleri	c and recorder is required to have voter	
26		service and polling centers open for	an election in accordance with the	
27		applicable election laws of the State or	as may be provided by the Charter, this	
28		Code, or any rule or regulation adopted	by the clerk and recorder, the twenty-	
29		five (25) day period shall commence or	the day after the election. In the event	
30		the clerk and recorder determines that	at the petition contains an insufficient	
31		number of signatures, the clerk and	recorder shall notify the petitioners'	

1	committee of the insufficiency, and the petitioners' committee may cure the
2	insufficiency by filing an addendum to the original petition for the purpose of
3	offering such number of additional signatures as will cure the insufficiency. Any
4	addendum shall be filed within the time period allowed for the original petition
5	as provided in this Charter. The clerk and recorder shall record and hold any
6	addendum for an additional period of twenty-five (25) days and verify the
7	signatures on the addendum in the same manner as is provided for the original
8	petition. Within the twenty-five-day period for review of the petition or any
9	addendum thereto, a protest subscribed and sworn to under oath may be filed
10	by a registered elector. A protestor shall identify by name the signers protested
11	against or specify the factual and legal basis of any other alleged defects in the
12	petition. The clerk and recorder shall consider the grounds of protest and may
13	hear evidence, after giving notice of the hearings to the petitioners' committee,
14	the protestors, and others the clerk and recorder may require for the hearings.
15	Hearings shall be concluded and findings issued as soon as practicable but not
16	more than fifty (50) days after the filing of a protest with the clerk and recorder.
