
#### 2013-2017 Municipal Cases


# Municipal Diversion Case Snapshot\*




2018 Municipal Diversion Cases Gender



# Denver Juvenile Justice Overview

## **Restorative Justice**

- Partnership between DPSYP, Denver DA Diversion Program, and Denver Juvenile Probation
- Municipal and District cases
- DPSYP/DPS partnership to support additional Attendance Mediation Workshops

## Challenges

- Reduction in detention beds at Gilliam.
- Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC).
- Weapons-related offenses
- Resources for Municipal Court

### Future

- Increase access to prevention services that support the whole family.
- Increase in-home and communitybased services.
- Age of delinquency
- Problem-Solving Court
