### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Division of Small Business Opportunity is governed by the DRMC Chapter 28 Articles III, V, VII. The last Ordinance was implemented in 2014, with a sunset date of April 1, 2019.

In the past year, DSBO has worked with multiple stakeholder groups and a third-party consultant to make recommendations to the Ordinance with the goal of improving DSBO and the services provided for small, minority and women-owned businesses. DSBO is committed to addressing these recommendations by making changes to the Ordinance, Rules and Regulations and internal policy & procedures.

Furthermore, OED secured BBC Research & Consulting to complete a citywide Disparity Study to measure the utilization of small, minority and women-owned businesses on city contracts. A draft of the study was completed in Fall 2018; a final report will be released in Winter 2019. Data from the Disparity Study will guide policy decisions and potential changes to the DSBO program.

DSBO continues to engage the community and business owners to prioritize recommendations.

**Amendments to the DSBO Ordinance** will extend the DSBO program for eight months to allow for more time to discuss community recommendations to the DSBO program and identify needed changes to the Ordinance, Rules and Regulations or internal policies and procedures.

- Amendments will also include lengthening the certification term for SBEs and MWBEs from one year to three years, an adjustment that we believe will remove unnecessary administrative burdens for DSBO staff and certified firms.
- Finally, the amendments will clarify DSBO's goal-setting process now that we have discontinued using external community stakeholders as committee members. This shift was made to bring our goal-setting process in line with city procurement standards as defined by the City Attorney's Office, and to further reduce the potential for a conflict of interest or premature disclosure of project information prior to advertisement.
- In addition, amendments will address definitions and typos.
