It's easy to get e-cigarettes?	48% say "Yes"



tobacco retailers in Denver have received at least one violation for selling tobacco to minors***



PROPOSED CHANGES TO CHAPTER 24 OF D.R.M.C.

- ✓ Increase the minimum age of sale for tobacco products from 18 to 21
- ✓ Remove the sale of tobacco products from vending machines
- ✓ Clean-up language to maintain consistency across department (i.e. remove show cause language and change retailer to "person" that includes all business entities and individuals)

TIMELINE	IMPLEMENTATION	
Phase I	 Formal Notice (two weeks) Retailers will receive notice of the changes and two signs enclosed for posting on-site Retailers we know sell tobacco products through vending machines will be notified inperson of these changes No inspections will be conducted during this time 	
Phase II	 Soft Enforcement (3 months) Retailers will be inspected once with no fines issued for violations Retailers who violate will be issued a warning letter Violations will not be included in current fine schedule 	
Phase III	 Full Enforcement (ongoing) Revisit retailers and issue fines for violations Citations issued based on current fine schedule
