**A BILL**

**For an ordinance amending division 1 of article V of chapter 18 of the D.R.M.C. to remove elected officials as persons eligible for paid time off.**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

**Section 1.** Subsection (a) of section 18-123, D.R.M.C. is amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

**Sec. 18-123. - Eligibility.**

(a) All officers (~~elected and appointed~~) and employees hired or rehired by the city after December 31, 2009, shall receive PTO as provided in this division, with the exception of:

(1) Part-time employees who are regularly scheduled to work less than twenty (20) hours per week;

(2) Members of the classified service of the police and fire departments;

(3) Employees in the deputy sheriff classifications;


(4) Employees occupying on-call, temporary, seasonal, or contract positions, or positions in which the incumbent is paid according to the community rate schedule; or employees who meet the requirements of subsection 18-408(j)(7) of this chapter;

(5) Elected officers.

**Section 2.** Effective date and applicability.

This bill is effective July 15, 2019 and applies to terms of office commencing on and after that date.
