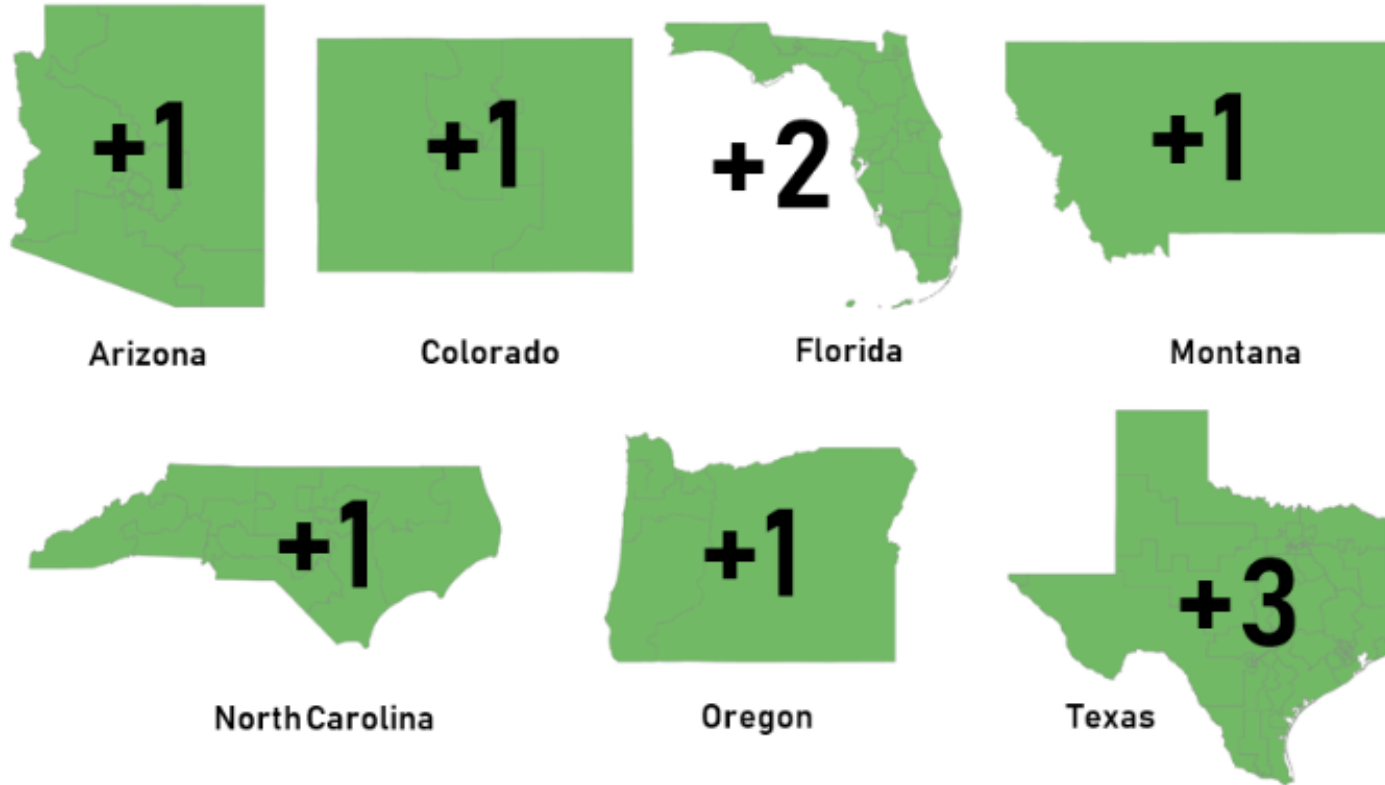


Why is the Census important to Denver?



Colorado is projected to gain a U.S. Congressional seat

States **likely to GAIN** one or more congressional seats following the 2020 Census



In 2010, 25% of

not “self-respond”
meaning they did not
answer the Census
form without
outreach from the
U.S. Census Bureau in
the form of a
telephone call or in-
person visit.

How many traditionally undercounted people live in Denver?



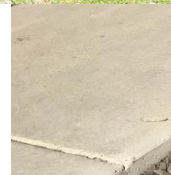

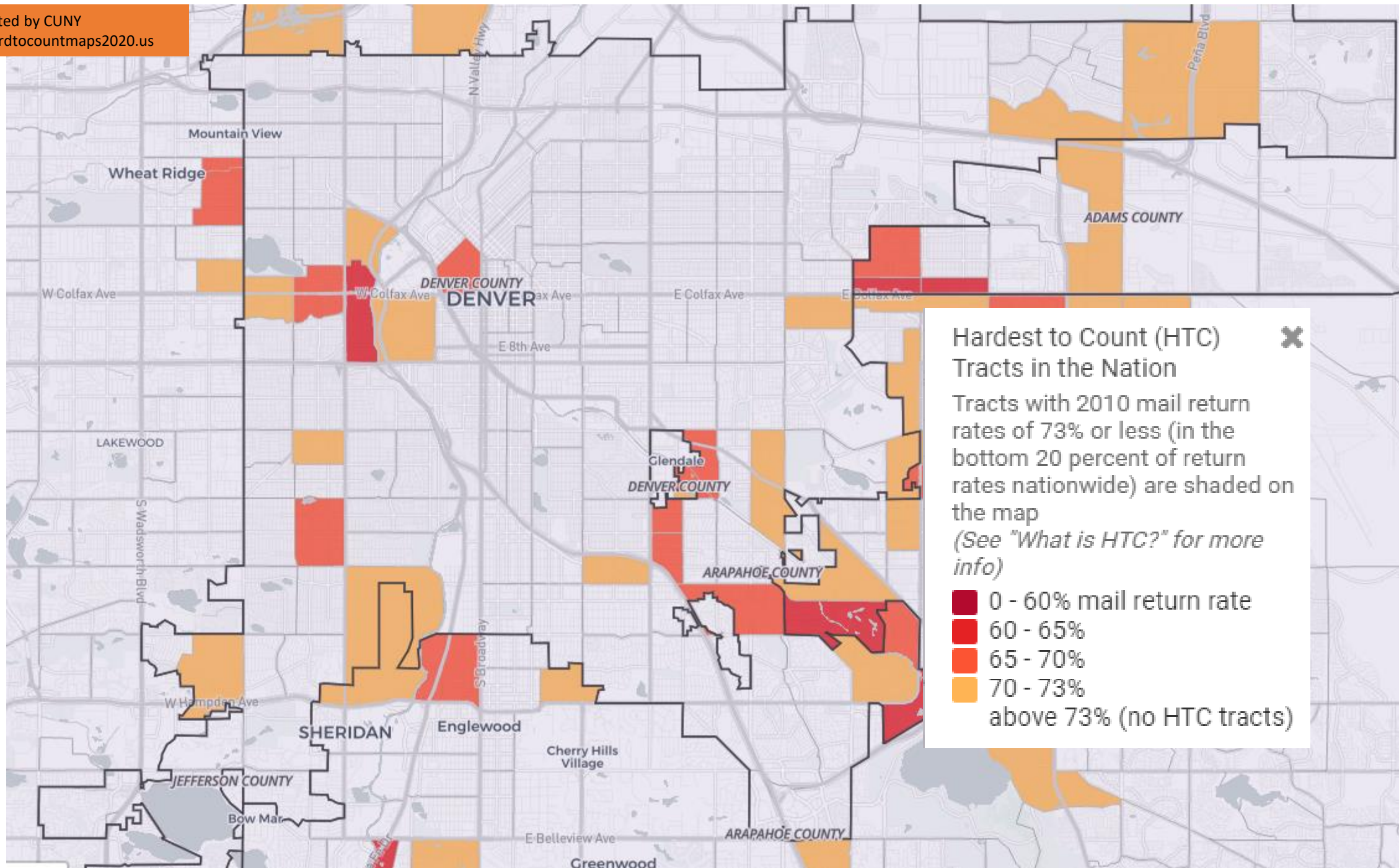
Proposed State Funding for Census 2020 Outreach by County

Denver	704,621	25%	176,155	\$352,311	17,616	\$440,388	8,808	\$660,582	\$1,453,281

Colorado Fiscal Institute estimates that **176,155 Denver residents** will not self-respond to the 2020 Census.

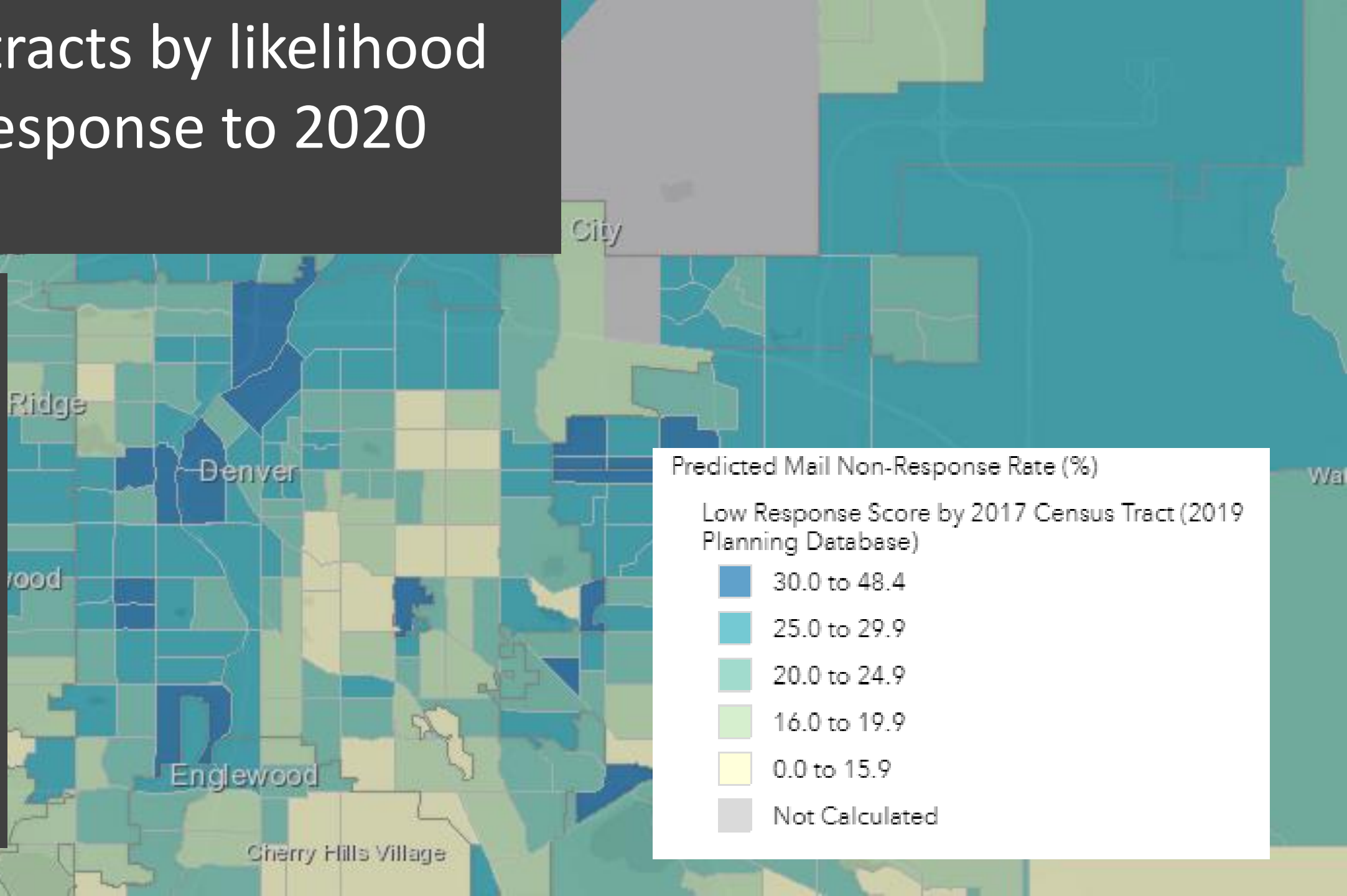
Where in Denver

Complete Count Committee

- Chairs: Councilwoman Ortega, Dr. Janine Davidson (Metro State) and Pastor Del Phillips
- 13 Subcommittees: focused on specific constituencies or interests
 - Health, education, immigrants, re-entry from incarceration, faith, etc.

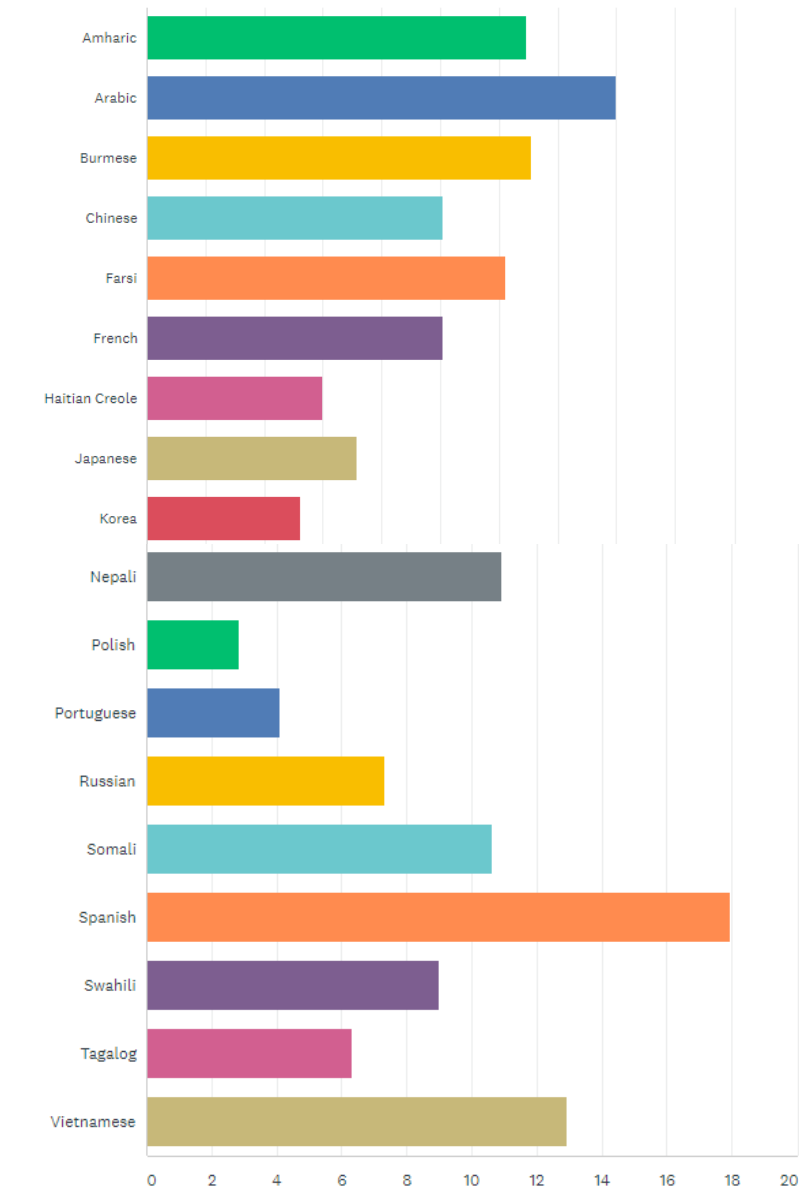
On-the-Ground Awareness

- January – March 2020 – Peak time to educate on Census
- March – May 2020 – Call to action
 - Residents hear about the census in media AND through trusted voices in their community
 - On-the-ground outreach to encourage Census completion

What can City Council do?

- Be a “Census Ambassador” – help dispel myths and encourage participation by your residents
 - Remind your residents that
 - The Census is for all of US.
 - The Census is SAFE.
 - The Census is easy.
 - The Census affects your community.
 - This is how we get our tax-dollars BACK to community from the federal government.
- Let us know when community events are happening, especially when traditionally undercounted folks will be in attendance
- Invite us – any of us or a combination of us – to speak to your constituents
- Let us know who we should connect with in your office to move this work forward.



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
