A BILL

For an ordinance amending the classification and pay plan for employees in the Career Service and for certain employees not in the Career Service.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 9.1.1 (C) and (D) of the Charter and Article I of Chapter 18, D.R.M.C., the Office of Human Resources has recommended to the City Council an amendment to the classification and pay plan governing the compensation of employees in the career service and certain employees not in the career service;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. That effective **beginning of the first work week following approval by the Mayor or by the City Council over the Mayor's veto**, the classification and pay plan is hereby amended by creating the following classifications:

<u>Proposed Class Title</u>	<u>Proposed Pay Grade & Range</u>
Trades and Vocational Intern	A-411 (\$15.61 – \$16.56 – \$17.57)
Field Intern	A-412 (\$17.89 – \$18.98 – \$20.14)
Professional Administration Intern	A-413 (\$18.84 – \$19.99 – \$21.21)
Professional Technical Intern	A-414 (\$19.95 – \$21.17 – \$22.46)

Section 2. That effective **beginning of the first work week following approval by the Mayor or by the City Council over the Mayor's veto**, the classification and pay plan is hereby amended by abolishing the following classifications:

<u>Current Class Title</u>	<u>Pay Grade</u>
Parks Intern I	J-405 (\$11.84)
Parks Intern II	J-407 (\$13.53)
Parks Intern III	J-409 (\$15.23)
Professional Occupational Intern I	A-404 (\$13.90)
Professional Occupational Intern II	A-406 (\$15.88)
Professional Occupational Intern III	A-408 (\$17.87)


Section 3. That the foregoing amendments shall be reflected in the full classification and pay plan kept and maintained in the office of the Clerk and Recorder, as reflected at Clerk Filing
