




EXISTING CONDITIONS













CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE: PHASES I & II

Stockyard and Stockyard Event Center: 2019- 2021

Equestrian Center: 2020 - 2022

Livestock Center: 2021 - 2023

South Platte Riverfront: 2021 - 2023





COUNCIL ACTION

- Rail relocation is critical to delivering the National Western Center campus and we have worked for more than 3 years to reach an agreement with Denver Rock Island Railroad (DRIR)
- CB19-0873 Approves a settlement agreement with DRIR for \$16.75 million.
- This agreement funds:
 - City acquisition of real and personal property
 - Relocation costs of their rail line and business operations on the site
 - DRIR will remain operational and will not be relocated until new rail lines are complete and operational
- The agreement also includes:
 - Easement for DRIR operations along new corridor
 - Agreement on operations and maintenance of the new corridor
- Access easements for DRIR to access north and south sections of rail from public NATIONAL right-of-way

TRANSACTION DETAILS

Consolidation and relocation of more than 14,000 ft. – or almost 3 miles – of railroad tracks at NWC will:

- Re-establish access to South Platte River
- Provide needed environmental cleanup
- Provide newer, safer rail corridor for visitors, residents, employees and animals
