6 7 8 9 10	For an ordinance conforming city code with historical city practices and revisions to charter section 2.9.3 if approved by electors at a special municipal election to be held in conjunction with the coordinated election of November 5, 2019.		
11	WHEREAS, the agency known as Denver a	arts and venues plays an integral role	
12	in promoting cultural and arts events in the community, administering the public art		
13	program, and in the management and control of city property used for theatre, concerts,		
14	conventions, and for other cultural purposes; and		
15	WHEREAS, on November 5, 2019, Denver arts and venues intends to seek		
16	electoral approval for revisions to city charter section 2.9.3 to conform the charter to		
17	certain historical practices.		
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:		
19	Section 1. That section 2-191, D.R.M.C	. shall be amended by deleting the	
20	language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:		
21	Section 2-191. <u>Denver</u> Arts and Venues <del>Denver</del>		
22	<u>Denver</u> Aarts and venues <del>Denver</del> shall be <del>the divis</del>	ion of general services-responsible for	
23	the occupancy and operations, care, repair and m	naintenance, either by the agency, or	
24	under contract and the direction of the agency, o	of all facilities, structures, or parts of	
25	structures owned or leased by the City and County and used for theatre, concert,		
26	auditorium, convention, <del>or</del> arena <u>, or other cultural</u>	purposes, for management of the City	
27	and County cultural and arts events, and for adm	ninistration of the public art program,	
28	creative sector development programs, and all related duties as described in this division,		
29	unless otherwise assigned by the Mayor. Denver Arts and Venues shall also have the		
30 31	management and control of all land on which such the section is a shall have the right to establish and make reasonab		

<u>and structures unless otherwise assigned by the Mayor.</u> The division of <u>Denver</u> arts and
 venues <del>Denver</del> may perform other duties assigned by the <u>mayor</u> manager of general
 services not inconsistent with the Charter or the Code.

4 **Section 2.** That section 2-192, D.R.M.C. shall be amended by deleting the 5 language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

## 6 Section 2-192. Director and other employees.

- 7 (a) The position of director of <u>Denver</u> arts and venues <del>Denver</del> is hereby established as
  8 a position of employment in Denver the arts and venues <del>Denver</del>.
- 9 (b) The <u>Denver</u> arts and venues <del>Denver</del> director shall <u>devote full time duties to the office</u>
- 10 and shall be an appointee of the mayor, serving at the pleasure of the mayor.be

11 responsible to the manager of general services for the performance of the functions,

12 powers and duties assigned to arts and venues Denver by this division, subject to and

- 13 consistent with the provisions of the Charter.
- 14 **Section 3**. That section 2-193, D.R.M.C. shall be amended by deleting the 15 language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

16 Section 2-193. Powers and duties.

- (1) Work with the mayor, the city council, and all affected or interested departments,
  commissions, boards, officers, offices, agencies and employees of the city in cultural
  development activities and in operation and management of theatre, concert, auditorium,
  convention or arena venues; and
- (2) Coordinate the activities of contractors and coordinate the various departments,commissions, boards, officers, offices, agencies and employees of the city in the
- 23 preparation of those activities; and
- (3) Review and analyze provisions of ordinances, rules, executive orders and other
  regulatory documents that may affect artistic activity in the city and advise the mayor and
  city council; and
- (4) Administer the city's public art program, whereby a portion of capital improvementresource is utilized for public art; and
- 29 (5) <u>Help to a</u>Attract <u>and retain</u> creative businesses and operations to Denver; and
- 30 (6) Act as liaison between the city and the Colorado Cereative lindustries or its state-
- 31 authorized successor; and

- (7) Assist the Denver district county cultural council and the Denver metropolitan
   <u>sScientific</u> and <u>eCultural fFacilities dDistrict</u> with administration and distribution of
   revenues under state law; and
- 4 (8) Encourage the utilization of creative local professionals and businesses; and

5 (9) Coordinate the efforts of <u>Denver</u> arts and venues in assisting increasing tourism and

- 6 visitorship in the city; and
- 7 (10) Provide technical assistance and information to arts and cultural groups concerning
- 8 funding, grants, loans, and other forms of assistance available to them; and
- 9 (11) Promote the venues and arts of the city to connect community members and visitors
- 10 with Denver's arts and entertainment sector; and

(12) Encourage the incorporation of art in privately funded activities and capitalimprovements; and

- 13 (13) Work with the departments designated by <u>c</u>Charter to acquire and construct all
- facilities, structures, or parts of structures owned or leased by the city and county andused for theatre, concert, auditorium or arena purposes; and
- 16 (14) Maintain, repair, manage and operate all facilities, structures, or parts of structures
- 17 owned or leased by the city and county and used for theatre, concert, auditorium,
- 18 convention, or arena purposes; and
- 19 (15) Perform centralized administrative functions for all arts and venues facilities,
- 20 including budgeting, revenue receipt, and coordination of capital improvements; and
- 21 (16) Provide event support services, including booking, contract administration, ticketing,
- 22 customer service, parking, and production services; and
- 23 (17) Oversee the utilization of city venues and generation of revenue by promoting cultural
- 24 tourism; and
- 25 (18) Develop policies and procedures for fair corporate access to sponsorships of city
- 26 events, arts, and venues; and
- (19) Develop financial processes with a goal of maintaining and preserving the agency's
  venues-; and
- 29 (20) Offer free and low cost cultural programs for the enjoyment and enrichment of
- 30 residents and visitors of the city.
- 31 Section 4. That section 2-194, D.R.M.C. shall be amended by deleting the

1 language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

## 2 Section 2-194. Rules and regulations.

The <u>Denver</u> arts and venues director is hereby delegated the authority to promulgate such rules and regulations and informal guidelines as may be necessary or desirable to effect the purposes of this division of the code.

6 **Section 5.** That section 2-275, D.R.M.C. shall be amended by deleting the 7 language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

## 8 Section 2-275. Procedure for naming buildings other than fire houses.

9 (b) Buildings other than fire houses and major components of buildings other than fire 10 houses shall only be named for outstanding persons who have been influential in the 11 cultural, political, economical or social life of the community or in recognition of an 12 individual or corporation which has contributed substantial funding for the construction of 13 the public buildings or major component of public buildings. In addition, major 14 components of buildings managed by the director of the division of Denver arts and 15 venues Denver, or other designee of the manager of the department of general services, 16 pursuant to section 2.9.3(E) of the Charter ("theatres and arenas facilities"), may be 17 named in recognition of substantial financial contributions to the city by individuals or 18 entities for the administration, construction, management, maintenance, operation or 19 repair of theatres and arenas facilities.

Section 6. If any section, paragraph, clause, or other portion of this ordinance is
 held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the validity of the remaining portion of
 this ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 7. This ordinance shall only be effective after certification of passage by
electors of a referred question revising charter section 2.9.3 at a special municipal
election to be held in conjunction with the coordinated election of November 5, 2019, and
upon publication and filing of such results with the Secretary of State.
