Executive Summary/Background Information

- The Fund was originally established with \$200,000 in public funds from the City. Other funding was received in the form of grants and private donations. To date, the Fund has distributed \$382,500 to four organizations: Justice and Mercy Legal Aid Clinic, Lutheran Family Services, Rocky Mountain Immigrant Advocacy Network (RMIAN), and the University of Denver. The organizations have provided direct legal services to immigrants eligible for relief, have hired and trained additional attorneys, and have held naturalization and 'Know Your Rights' workshops.
- The Fund is producing the results that it was supposed to produce and nonprofit partners are seeing hundreds of clients, including almost 20 really intensive cases in the Aurora detention center
- Nonprofit partners, including RMIAN, have hired staff to be able to produce those results and are relying on the Fund for the sustainability of those staff positions at this point
- Private fundraising has been done outside the City in addition to the public investment, but building momentum for this type of Fund takes time and we have not been able to attain the level of funding that came into the Fund last year and that we had anticipated for this year
- In addition, the Fund received a one-time grant from the Vera Institute for \$100,000 which was not eligible for renewal. The Fund and HRCP are working with a grant writer to seek additional grant funding for next year, but it will not come in time to fill the funding gap this year
- Additional fundraising efforts have begun for a benefit concert. The City and The Denver Foundation as partners will ensure that we have stable funding in future years
- Time is short and the many clients who would be seen by our nonprofit partners will not receive services if nonprofits have to cut back on these highly successful programs
- This is a one-time request that will make a difference for hundreds of immigrants and their families in Denver at a critical time
