Denver College Affordability Fund

- Ordinance passed by Denver Voters in November 2018
- Created new Charitable Organization DCSC
- Funded by .8% Sales Tax increase
 - About 1 cent on \$10 purchase
 - Total projected revenue for 2019: approx. \$11.8
 million

Purpose: to increase college enrollment and degree completion by Denver Residents through support of scholarship organizations

Supported Organization Requirements

- Colorado Nonprofit
- In existence for three years
- Operationally and financially independent
- Provide post secondary scholarships and support services to Denver residents
- Other requirements established by DCSC board.



Reimbursement Guidelines

- Up to 75% reimbursement for scholarship and support services
- Students must complete academic year in good standing
- Supported organization must provide and maintain information required by DCSC
- Reimbursement 2x per year



Student Requirements

- Denver resident for at least 36 months
- Less than 25 years old
- Must attend post-secondary institution in Colorado
- Meet financial aid as determined by DCSC
- Continue to achieve "satisfactory academic progress"



Family Income Guidelines

- Reimbursement shall be funded based on the Federal Pell Grant program or comparable need analysis determined by DCSC
- Ordinance Limit is 2.5x Federal Pell Grant
- Sliding Scale to be set by DCSC





- Oversight provided by Office of Children's Affairs
- Annual contract, with renewal at City's option
 - Sunset provision after 12 years
- Administration expenses limited to 5% of tax collected (10% in first year only)
- 95% of tax reserved for reimbursement to scholarship organizations





- Sales tax distributions to DCSC monthly, with initial (2019) catch-up distribution following City Council contract approval
- Annual reconciliation of Sales Tax occurring in 2nd quarter of each year
- Provides carryover of unused funds to subsequent years



Contract Oversight and Reporting

Annual presentation to Mayor, City Council, Auditor and Public including:

- Number of students receiving funds
- Metrics tracking students year over year
- Number of organizations receiving funds
- Inventory of student support services
- Financial review
- Annual audited financial statements



Contract Oversight and Reporting

Quarterly Progress Reports to OCA

- Detailed metrics and compliance reporting
- Financial reporting
- Internal controls
- Board Involvement
- Creation of standardized reports
- 1st report: Q4 2019



Contract Oversight and Reporting

- City and Auditor have right to examine all books, records or documents
- City may terminate for cause (with 90-day notice for cure)
- DCSC required to maintain standard forms of insurance
- DCSC provides Indemnity to City


