

## CdeBaca Amendment No. 6 to the Mayor's Proposed 2020 Budget 19-1226

Mr. President: I move that the Mayor's Proposed 2020 Budget be amended in the following particulars:

- 1. On page 367, in the line titled "Administration," (Appropriation 0115000) reduce the amount in the 2020 Recommended column by \$250,000 from \$2,296,195 to \$2,046,195.
- 2. On page 271, in the line titled "Office of Climate Action, Sustainability and Resilience," (Appropriation 0107000) increase the amount in the 2020 Recommended column by \$250,000 from \$4,898,702 to \$5,148,702. This increase is for additional funding towards subsidies for solar panels.
- Make other appropriate adjustments to comments, tables, schedules, and figures in the Mayor's Proposed 2020 Budget as may be required to reflect the actions directed in this amendment.

**Explanation:** By utilizing the management capacity of the new Office of Climate Action, Sustainability and Resiliency and investing \$0 in city-owned infrastructure, the City of Denver would enter into direct partnerships with the city's homeowners, a commercial solar integrator, and Xcel Energy. Under this P4 (Public, Private, Provider Partnership), the City will "piggy-back" onto the systems leased by homeowners from largescale residential solar integrators. According to The SunRoof Project, there are currently 129,000 solar-viable roofs in the City and County of Denver. Each of these viable locations represents a suitable solar generation site that does not require the additional costs of land acquisition. 25% of all viable roofs will be included in initial phase.
