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BACKGROUND

- DSBO's authority is created by Executive Order, the Construction Ordinance, and the Goods & Services Ordinance, and both ordinances are re-authorized at five-year intervals.
- The <u>Construction Ordinance is found in D.R.M.C. Chapter 28 Article III</u>; the Goods & Services Ordinance in Article V; and Small Business Enterprise in Article VII.
- The purpose of D.R.M.C Chapter 28 Article III, V, and VII is to enable the city, through the departments and agencies of the city, to <u>undertake specific activities</u> <u>to prevent discrimination and its effects against business enterprises that have</u> <u>been certified as M/WBEs AND SBEs.</u>



WE ARE REQUESTING A SIX-MONTH EXTENSION

ensure a robust, comprehensive reauthorization that includes both Ordinance changes and rules & regulations.

Current sunset: 12/31/19

Proposed sunset: 7/1/20

To Expand Opportunities

- Significant expansion of goods & services categories and thresholds applied to the Purchasing Program
- Ability to assign goals to individual task orders and work orders for on-call contracts
- Ensuring equity and utilization language in contract and procurement language





To Increase Oversight

- Preparing, approving, and ensuring quality control for M/WBE language in procurement and contract
- Prevent termination of a subcontractor without good cause
- Defining compliant vs. non-compliant processes with more ability to apply corrective actions and/or sanctions
- Added protections for whistleblowers





To Ensure Transparency and Fairness

- M/WBE utilization plans are due at time of bid opening (not three days later)
- "Commercially useful function" is further defined to ensure that small businesses are responsible for performing and controlling the work as stipulated in the contract – eliminating pass-throughs and conduits
- Internal goal-setting process informed by data analysis, availability





To Provide Clarification

- What counts toward goal (i.e., regular supplier)
- Defined "good faith effort" and the process by which it is evaluated
- Re-organized the Ordinances in a more logical manner for better readability





To Respond to the Changing Marketplace

- Defining parameters for public/private partnerships, integrated contracts
- Putting in place systems to address complex projects, including creative strategies to advance M/WBEs as primes
- Allowing flexibility and consistency with small biz certification size standards for changes in the industry, market and business practices





To Streamline Processes and Timing

- Move to three-year certification (from annual)
- Modifying and advancing information required during contract procurements and throughout the life of the contract
- Refining guidelines through improved inter-agency coordination





To Remove Barriers

- Strengthen prompt pay for all M/WBE subcontractor tiers working on City projects
- Formalize engagement by Business Equity Leadership Team (BELT) advisory committee to focus concerted efforts towards equity and maximizing opportunities
- Establishment of Citywide Utilization Plans to create accountability and promote the responsibility of all city agencies . . . and not just DSBO



NEXT STEPS: RULES & REGULATIONS

Proposed Timeline

- Reoccurring Weekly Inter-agency Workgroups (DPW, DPR, DEN, DSBO)
 These groups launched the week of October 28, 2019
 Anticipated End Date: January 31, 2020
- 20 Day Public Comment Period: tentatively May 10-30, 2020
- Public Meeting on Rule & Reg: tentatively May 15, 2020
- Rule & Reg Finalized: June 15, 2020

Approach


- Internal Agency Collaborative Weekly Workgroups
