

URBAN FOREST INITIATIVE: CREATING A LIVABLE & HEALTHY CENTER CITY LUTI COMMITTEE | DECEMBER 3, 2019



19-1291

- Approves an agreement with Denver Civic Ventures to fund the Urban Forest Initiative grant program.
- Through public-private partnership, the program will expand and enhance downtown's urban tree canopy by planting and/or improving existing planting areas for 400 to 500 trees.
- Contract expires 12/31/2024.
- Parks & Recreation will reimburse one-third of project costs, up to \$3 million.




Downtown Denver's Expanding Residential Population











When measured against 20 other American cities, downtown Denver ranked the lowest for urban tree canopy with 4% coverage. Parks & Recreation's stated goal is 10%



Downtown Denver "Urban Heat Island"








Rank your top three priorities for basic amenities.



Ballot Measure 2A

- Acquiring additional land for parks, trails, and open space;
- Developing, improving, and maintaining new and existing parks, trails, and open space, including in Denver's mountain parks;
- Restoring and protecting waterways, rivers, canals and streams;
- Purchasing, planting, and caring of trees, such as Urban Forest Initiative Grant Program and Equity Neighborhood Tree Planting Program; And
- Operating and maintaining any related additional acquisitions and capital improvements.











Growing the Urban Forest | 15th Street








Growing the Urban Forest | Broadway

Broadway & Blake Pop-up Park | Resolution Request

19-1308

- Amends cooperative agreement with RiNo Art District.
 - Adds one year with option to renew an additional year at the discretion of DPR's executive director.
- RiNo Art District solely funds the design, construction, programming and maintenance of neighborhood pop-up pocket park.
- No funding required by the City.
 - City will provide trash removal and administrative support




 43.7% of the Downtown study area is a park desert with no neighborhood or special use parks within a five minute walk.

Broadway & Blake Pop-up Park | Background

Pop-Up Park Goals:

- Innovate and adapt use of public right-of-way to create green spaces and places for people - a neighborhood pocket park for social gatherings and celebration of arts and culture.
- Contribute to fostering a livable, multi-generational downtown yearround.
- Cultivate the identity and culture of the neighborhood.
- Create a resilient and functionally sustainable outdoor public space.










Broadway & Blake Pop-up Park | Background

- Pop-up design and construction was privately funded by community partners.
- RiNo Art District funds and activates the pop-up park through year-round programs.
- RiNo Art District funds and provides maintenance via Denver Day Works / Bayaud Enterprises.
