13	WHEREAS, in the 2018 and 2019 legislative sessions, the Colorado Legislature passed two		
14	bills that will result in a substantial increase in the caseload of the Denver County Court, specifically		
15	Senate Bill 18-056 increases the civil threshold from \$15,000 to \$25,000 and House Bill 19-1263		
16	which changes the felony classification of some drug possessions to misdemeanors and will result in		
17	Denver County Court inheriting 3,000 cases;		
18	WHEREAS, as a result of the significant increase in caseload of the Denver County Court, the		
19	Court is seeking one additional judicial position in the 2020 budget cycle and one additional judicial		
20	position in the 2021 budget cycle;		
21	WHEREAS, Denver County Court has proposed the amendment to reflect the newly created		
22	2020 position.
