




- Gun violence affecting youth is a serious problem in Denver
- Gun violence is preventable

 African-American youth, specific neighborhoods
- We know what works:
 - Public health approach, comprehensive strategic plans
 - Lessons from other cities
- Denver has opportunities for action



2012-2018 Annual Average




Youth Directly Affected by Gun Violence Annually


- An average of 13 young people die each year in Denver from gunshot wounds.
- About one third of those deaths are due to suicide and two thirds to homicide.
- About 70 youth a year are injured badly enough to go to the emergency room or be hospitalized. On average.
- More than 600 Denver youth are victims of crimes involving guns each year.

Opportunities for Action

- Recognize gun violence as a **critical and preventable** public health problem.
- **Develop a community-informed, cross-sector strategic plan** to increase collaboration, leverage funds, and collectively achieve greater reductions in multiple types of violence affecting young people.
- Expand access to high quality, culturally competent resources that address the impact of trauma on individuals, families, and whole communities.
- Implement strategies that improve the quality of life for young people like **neighborhood economic development** and **youth employment**.
- **Begin violence prevention efforts during early childhood** since risks of involvement in gun-related crime increase rapidly as young people age.
- **Promote the use of safe storage (lock boxes) for guns** to provide an easy way for families to protect against unsafe use of guns.
