There is hereby submitted to the properly qualified and registered electors of the 17 City and County of Denver for their approval or rejection at a special municipal election to be 18 19 conducted at the same time and in conjunction with the coordinated election to be held in the City and County of Denver on November 5, 2020, a proposed amendment to the Charter of the City and 20 21 County of Denver, as follows: 22 23 Effective upon publication and filing with the Secretary of State pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado, the following sections of Article II of 24 the 2002 Charter of the City and County of Denver shall be and are hereby amended to 25 read as follows: 26 Part 3 of Article II shall be amended to add a new section to read as follows: 27 28 Part 3. – Transportation and Infrastructure 29 §2.3.5 – Board of Transportation and Infrastructure 30 There is hereby created a Board of Transportation and Infrastructure (hereinafter called the 31 "Board") consisting of nineteen members. Six members of the Board shall be appointed by the Mayor. Thirteen of the members shall represent the thirteen City Council members and shall be 32 33 appointed by the thirteen Councilmembers. The appointees of the eleven district Council members 34 shall reside in the district of the appointing member. The appointees of the two at-large

Councilmembers shall each reside in the City and County of Denver. Members shall serve at the

pleasure of their respective appointing authorities. Members of the Board should represent a variety of interests, including but not limited to pedestrian, bicycling, transit, freight and other multimodal interests. Members of the Board shall serve without pay. The Board shall advise the Manager with respect to the policy and operation of the Department and shall review and comment on the proposed annual budget for the Department.

Section 2. The voting machines and paper ballot for said election shall carry the following designation, which shall be the title and submission clause:

REFERRED QUESTION _____

Shall the Charter of the City and County of Denver be amended to create the Board of Transportation and Infrastructure to advise the Manager with respect to the policy and operation of the Department and shall review and comment on the proposed annual budget for the Department?

Section 3. Each elector voting at the election and wishing to for or against the amendment shall indicate the elector's choice by depressing the appropriate counter of the voting machine which indicates the word "YES" or the word "NO", or by appropriate marking upon paper ballots when used.

Section 4. The proper officials of the City and County of Denver as are charged with duties relating to the election shall, before the election, issue such calls, make such certifications and publications, give such notices, make such appointments, and do all such other acts and things in connection with the submission of this Charter amendment to the registered electors of the City and County of Denver at the election as are required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.

Section 5. The ballots cast at such election shall be canvassed and the results ascertained, determined, and certified in accordance with the requirements of the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.

Section 6. If any section, paragraph, clause, or other portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance shall not be affected.
