10	in Council chambers each Monday in regular session except as otherwise may be provided by		
11	ordinance; and,		
12	WHEREAS, City Council, by Section 13-2 of the D.R.M.C., observes certain holidays; and,		
13	WHEREAS, the City Council finds and declares that in periods of emergency, City Council		
14	may need to cancel or suspend its regular meeting schedule in the interest of the health, safety, and		
15	welfare of its residents and community; and,		
16	WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Mayor Michael B. Hancock filed with the CCD Clerk and		
17	Recorder, a State of Local Disaster Emergency Declaration (hereinafter "Declaration"); and,		
18	WHEREAS, emergency management, including meeting suspensions or closures, in times of		
19	public emergencies, disasters and threats to public safety not only for COVID-19, but for other		
20	emergencies too, is a vital part of local government, is a matter of local concern and protects the		
21	health, safety and welfare of the residents of, and visitors to, the City and County of Denver.		
22	NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED BY	THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF

24	Section 1. That a new section 13-3 be ad	lded to read as follows:	
25	Sec. 13-3. – <u>Cancelation of Monday regular sess</u>	ion during periods of emergency.	
26	City council may suspend or cancel regular meet	ings during periods of emergency. An emergency	
27	suspension or cancelation of any meetings sha	Ill be ordered by the Council President and may	
28	supersede council legislative rules to the extent no	ecessary to implement emergency plans. A period	
29	of emergency shall remain in effect until the Mayo	or, City Council, or Council President declares that	
30	the threat of danger has passed, or that the emergency condition no longer exists, and that the		
31	emergency condition is no longer required to rec	eive State and Federal assistance and terminates	
32	the declaration or resolution.
