5. General description or background of proposed request. Attach executive summary if more space needed:

In 2017, DEN signed contracts with HNTB Corp and Jacobs Engineering Group to provide Architectural and Engineering Design Services relating to DEN's Expansion and Renewal Program.

Since the execution of the original contracts, the program has progressed, and the airport/airline industry has been impacted with the COVID-19 Pandemic. The airlines have signed lease agreements for the additional gates requiring us to take on additional work to move airlines. The industry impacts associated with the pandemic has driven a re-evaluation of our Capital Improvement Program as it relates to the concourse areas. To meet the needs of the Expansion and Renewal Program and the reprioritization of our Capital Improvement Program, this amendment will allow us to do the following:

- Airlines have signed leases for all the additional gates, in order to meet our commitment to the airlines, DEN must relocate airlines and build out space for office and support needs.
- In order to take advantage of some gates being out of service for interior work, we plan to coordinate needed exterior rehabilitation of pavement, utility and in pavement fueling systems.
 - o Renovate existing hold rooms, conveyances, bathrooms and finishes in the concourses in late 2020, 2021 and 2022. Accelerating these programs, that we already included as part of our existing CIP will: Save costs and allow renovations to move faster and reduce traveler inconvenience. (Compared to waiting until after the gates build out is complete and traffic has recovered.)

As the crisis created by the Coronavirus took hold, DEN quickly took steps to freeze spending on our O&M budget and began a process to evaluate and re-prioritize our capital program. We anticipate a slow recovery of traffic at DEN. In recognition of that, we plan to delay some projects that are not immediately needed. The construction and design teams are already on site and we can quickly take advantage of reduced passenger traffic and fulfill the airport's long-term plans to replace aging infrastructure across the concourses. We can close and complete larger areas with minimal impact to operations. Additionally, moving ahead with the plan will keep more people working and in a way that is safe and healthy, as well as implementing needed improvements.

This amendment to the HNTB contract along with the amendment to the Jacobs contract (separate request) will increase contract capacity to accommodate the additional project delivery options.
