What Could the Process Look Like?

- Mayor chooses the candidate s/he would like to put forward
- Appointment would require majority Council approval
- Standard resolution with 30-day shot clock
- Appointment would go through on consent unless called out by a Council member
- If called out, Council questions would be asked during a meeting of the supervising committee for that agency
- After committee, vote of full Council would occur at regularly scheduled Council meeting



Other Considerations


- Mayor retains sole dismissal authority to respect the strongmayor system. Council does not have the power to engage in administrative affairs.
- Resolution calls for positions to be filled in a "timely manner"
- If passed by a vote of the people, law becomes effective upon publication and filing with the Secretary of State
- Stakeholder process should be convened to determine the Council appointment approval policies and procedures

Would you support a Charter change to give City Council approval of Mayoral Cabinet Appointees and Denver's three Heads of Safety?


