22	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF

25	5 Section 1. A new fund is hereby established in the	General Government Special Revenue		
26	6 Fund, Accounting No. 11000, a "Climate State Grants"	Fund, Accounting No. 11303, for the		
27	7 purpose of accounting for the receipt and expenditure of	state grants awarded to the Office of		
28	Climate Action, Sustainability and Resiliency.			
29	9 Section 2. Monies received from state awards su	upporting climate, sustainability and/or		
30	resilience initiatives shall be deposited into the Treasury of the City and credited to Special			
31	1 Revenue Fund No. 11000, which is set forth and desci	ribed in Section 20-18 of the Revised		
32	Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver.			
33	3 Section 3. Expenditures are hereby authorized for	or the "Climate State Grants" Fund,		
34	Accounting No. 11303, in the amount not to exceed the amounts awarded as described in Section			
35	5 2 of this Ordinance, to be expended by the Executive D	irector of the Office of Climate Action,		

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1 Sustainability and Resiliency or his or her designate or other authorized officials. This Fund is 2 sponsor-funded and non-lapsing.

3 **Section 4.** The proposed Grant Agreement between the City and County of Denver and 4 the Colorado Department of Local Affairs, for the "Renewable Denver Initiative" program, which is 5 identified as Grant Number EIAF 9227, a copy of which is duly filed with the City Clerk, Filing No. 6 202055160, be and hereby is approved in all respects.

7 Section 5. The payments made by the State of Colorado to the City pursuant to and under the Grant Agreement shall be deposited into the Treasury of the City and credited to Special 8 9 Revenue Fund No. 11000, which is set forth and described in Section 20-18 of the Revised 10 Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver.

11 Section 6. That it be and is hereby found and determined that the budget summary of said 12 program, to be expended by the Executive Director of the Office of Climate Action, Sustainability 13 and Resiliency, is as follows:
