15	WHEREAS, the Office of Climate Action, Sustainability and Resiliency (CASR) was			
16	established in the past year to elevate and expand the City and County of Denver's climate			
17	initiatives; and			
18	WHEREAS, CASR has been awarded a grant from the Colorado Department of Local			
19	Affairs for the Renewable Denver Initiative under the Energy and Mineral Impact Assistance			
20 21	Program, and currently lacks a fund to administer the award;			
22	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF			
23	DENVER:

25	Section 1. A new fund is hereby established in the General Government Special Revenue			
26	Fund, Accounting No. 11000, a "Climate State Grants" Fund, Accounting No. 11303, for the			
27	purpose of accounting for the receipt and expenditure of state grants awarded to the Office of			
28	Climate Action. Sustainability and Resiliency.			

Section 2. Monies received from state awards supporting climate, sustainability and/or resilience initiatives shall be deposited into the Treasury of the City and credited to Special Revenue Fund No. 11000, which is set forth and described in Section 20-18 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver.

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Section 3. Expenditures are hereby authorized for the "Climate State Grants" Fund, Accounting No. 11303, in the amount not to exceed the amounts awarded as described in Section 2 of this Ordinance, to be expended by the Executive Director of the Office of Climate Action,

Sustainability and Resiliency or his or her designate or other authorized officials. This Fund is 1 2 sponsor-funded and non-lapsing. 3 **Section 4.** The proposed Grant Agreement between the City and County of Denver and the 4 Colorado Department of Local Affairs, for the "Renewable Denver Initiative" program, which is identified as Grant Number EIAF 9227, a copy of which is duly filed with the City Clerk, Filing No. 5 6 202055160, be and hereby is approved in all respects. 7 **Section 5.** The payments made by the State of Colorado to the City pursuant to and under 8 the Grant Agreement shall be deposited into the Treasury of the City and credited to Special 9 Revenue Fund No. 11000, which is set forth and described in Section 20-18 of the Revised 10 Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver. 11 **Section 6.** That it be and is hereby found and determined that the budget summary of said 12 program, to be expended by the Executive Director of the Office of Climate Action, Sustainability 13 and Resiliency, is as follows: 14 APPROPRIATION ACCOUNT **AMOUNT** ACCOUNTING NUMBER 11303-0107000 Renewable Denver Initiative \$1,000,000 15 Expenditures are authorized from June 15<sup>th</sup> to June 30, 2023. 16 17 **Section 7.** The Chief Financial Officer of the City and County of Denver is hereby 18 authorized and directed to make such book and record entries and to do such other things as may 19 be necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance. 20 21 22 23 24 [Signature page follows]. 25 26 27 28 29
