- 1. Why are you interested in serving on this advisory group? Please accept this response as my official statement of interest for the Housing Stability Strategic Advisors Group (HSSAG). I am particularly interested in serving on the HSSAG because of its unique emphasis on addressing homelessness, housing stability, and housing opportunities in the city of Denver, through direct advice and recommendations to the planning and implementation of city programs, services and expenditures. Furthermore, I hope to contribute to the vision, mission and values of the HSSAG by sharing my own experience as a long-time resident and community advocate in the Denver-Metro area. I believe the city of Denver would greatly benefit from working with residents who are directly impacted by the various housing issues previously described.
- 2. Why do you think you are qualified to serve on this advisory group? I believe my graduate education in urban and regional planning, as well as my professional and lived experience in community organizing and advocacy make me an ideal candidate for the HSSAG. I have been involved in housing related projects both in Denver and throughout the state of Colorado. I completed a housing needs assessment for the City of Fort Morgan as part of my graduate capstone project, supported the creation of a Housing 101 Tool Kit for CDPHE, helped fundraise for a housing project in Brighton that will serve young folks aging out of foster care and currently work as a project manager on the Montbello FreshLo Cultural Hub project with the Montbello Organizing Committee. The FreshLo project will be home to 96 units of affordable housing in the Montbello community.
- 3. Please list which position(s) you are interested in serving in for this advisory group. I believe my personal, professional and educational background would allow me to serve as an appointed member with professional and lived expertise in the effects of gentrification and displacement or housing instability on lower income households and/or as an appointed community member.
- 4. Are you interested in serving as a Council appointee, a Mayoral appointee, or either role on this advisory group? I am interested in serving on the HSSAG and do not have a preference on the type of appointment, it could be either Mayoral or through City Council.
- 5. What is your lived or professional expertise with gentrification/displacement, homelessness, and/or affordable housing? As a first-generation, Mexican-American, millennial, woman, my identity not only provides great insight as to how housing insecurity impacts low-income communities, communities of color, immigrants, millennials, and women, it also directly impacts my access to housing and housing outcomes. I am a resident of the Montbello neighborhood and have first-hand experience with gentrification, the effects of redlining, and the effects of divestment in communities of color.
- 6. How would your appointment contribute to greater inclusion or representation of communities with historic barriers to housing or service access? As a woman of color with lived, professional and educational experience, I bring greater diversity of thought and insight to spaces that traditionally do not represent communities of color, immigrants, women, or young people.
- 7. What relevant experience do you have with public funding or where might you need additional training to be effective in this role? I have an educational background that has provided me with a basic understanding of public funding, my current professional experience has also allowed me to learn and experience first-hand the public funding process, but I believe there is much more I can learn to be as effective as possible in this role.
